compelled to do it and have been bound down by the strictest rules of evidence.

When Mr. Carvell completed his argument, Mr. Fowler delivered a wild harangue accusing Mr. Carvell of insulting the commissioners by reflections on their methods of conducting the inquiry. He denounced the effort to secure the books as an exhibition of morbid curiosity by a group of scandal-mongers.

The chairman spoke of the alternative methods of conducting inquiries, saying that they might have ignored counsel entirely and called and examined the witnesses themselves, but they had chosen the other method as the fairer way.

Mr. Carvell asked the witness if the company had reached any conclusion regarding the construction of shops and terminals?

A.—Nothing has been done or will be done this year.

Q.—Will the I.C.R. take over the road without such facilities?

A.—Yes, temporarily.

Q.—Have you decided to build shops or terminals, or both at Woodstock?

A.—I have not heard of any decision.

To Mr. Carvell, the witness said that payment of \$17,544.15 and \$16,000 in July to the Prudential Trust Company were payments on the \$350,000 loan, and that about \$100,000 of this loan is still outstanding.

Mr. Thompson said that during July his company had done work to the value of \$130,000, but had not yet received a progress estimate or the money from the government, although by ordinary standards, it was overdue. Their work in August amounted to \$110,000, but this is not due yet. For June they received \$160,000. They had paid all their contractors for the June work, except Kennedy & McDonald.

GERMANS ARE MAKING AMAZING PROGRESS

(Continued from Page One.)

"Continuous fighting has been in progress all along the whole line of battle. The British cavalry engaged with distinction the cavalry of the enemy, and brushed them back and captured ten guns.

Petrograd, (St. Petersburg) Sept. 2.—The following official communication was issued by the Russian war office tonight:

"After a battle lasting seven days, the Russian army seized heavily fortified positions around Lemberg, about ten or twelve miles from the town. The Russian troops then advanced towards the principal forts.

"After a battle yesterday which was fiercely contested, the Austrians were obliged to retreat in disorder, abandoning heavy and light guns, parks of artillery and field kitchens.

"Our advance guard and cavalry pursued the enemy, who suffered enormous losses in killed, wounded and prisoners.

"The Austrian army operating in the neighborhood of Lemberg was composed of the third, eleventh and twelfth corps and part of the seventh and fourteenth corps. The army appears to have been completely defeated.

"During the pursuit by the Russian troops the Austrians who beat a retreat from Gulla Lipa, were forced to abandon an additional thirty-one guns.

"Our troops are moving over roads encumbered with parks of artillery and convoys loaded with provisions of various kinds.

"The total number of guns captured by the Russian around Lemberg amounts to 150."

The above despatch was sent direct from St. Petersburg by the St. Petersburg Telegraph Agency, the semi-official Russian news Agency, and is the first despatch received in New York direct from the Russian capital since the declaration of war.

WORLD'S NEWS IN SHORT METRE

New York, Sept. 3.—The London stock exchange within ten days will know all about when it will be possible to re-open. Advice to this effect have been received by banking interests in Wall Street. There still appears to be a feeling in London that the New York exchange will re-open first.

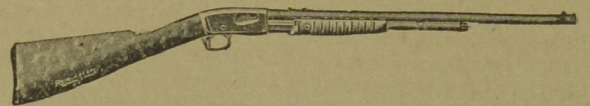
