CANADIAN RELIEF WORK DIFFICULTY

Ottawa, Dec. 5-At a meeting the Canadian Relief Committee held here, matters of interest to the sol. diers on Salisbury Plain and their mfort were considered. One of the comfort were considered. One of the principal items for discussion was the great number of unwarranted calls by individual mempers of the public for money and supplies for the Canad an troops in England, a matter which was greatly deprecated, as the Canadian Red Cross is giving every attenattention to these matters.


