MEXICO'S FAMOUS
ROMANTIC SEAPORT

Tampico the Noted Harbor Has Many Prosperous Industries

Until the trouble arose between the United States and Mexico, the average person probably knew little about Tampico. Nevertheless, it is a town which provides one of the most remarkable of modern romances of industrial investment.

Tampico became famous in the money market at the beginning of the great oil boom, and the idea of its importance in connection with that industry may be gathered from the fact that in about ten years nearly two hundred and fifty million dollars has been invested in the oilfields in the State of Tamaulipas to which Tampico belongs.

Of this total over \$75,000,000 represents British interests, and the amazing growth of oil properties in that corner of the world is illustrated by the fact that from the 1,000,000 barrels of oil secured in 1907, the figure has grown to 16,000,000, which was last year's total.

Apart from oil, however, Tampico which shares with Vera Cruz the greater portion of the foreign trade of Mexico, has quite a number of other prosperous industries, which have been greatly developed of late years by British and American residents who are more numerous in Tampico than in any other part of Mexico. The excellent harbor as a commodification of the town makes it the chief port for the exportation of coffee, sugar, rubber, copper ore and asphalt, the most important products of the neighboring territory.

The soil is very rich, and it is expected that within a few years there will be an enormous increase in the flourishing trade in fruit and vegetables. Furthermore, it is a fine centre for sea fishing. Indeed, it is the happy hunting-ground of the enthusiasts who delight to catch the big game of the sea, for in no other water can that giant fish, the tirpén, which attains a length of 6 feet or 7 feet, be found in such large numbers.

Most of the commerce of Vera Cruz is also in the hands of foreigners, although it is a place to be avoided by these who have a regard for their health. Its moist, hot climate is notoriously unhealthy, and the annual death-rate ranges from one in eleven to one in twenty of the population mostly from lung diseases and from yellow and other fevers. The full tide of the city is Villa Nueva de la Vera Cruz, or "New City of the True Cross."

CANADIAN RELIEF
WORK DIFFICULTY

Ottawa, Dec. 5.—At a meeting of the Canadian Relief Committee held here, matters of interest to the soldiers on Salisbury Plain and their comfort were considered. One of the principal items for discussion was the great number of unwarranted calls by individual members of the public for money and supplies for the Canadian troops in England, a matter which was greatly deprecated, as the Canadian Red Cross is giving every attention to these matters.

It was decided that the Canadian War Contingent Association, of which the Hon. George H. Perley is president, be recognized as agents for the distribution of comforts for officers and men of the Canadian contingents abroad. All red cross supplies will be distributed by the Red Cross Commissioner.

The following resolution was adopted: "That the Canadian Relief Committee hereby recognizes the National Committee of Woman's Patriotic Service (consisting of the Presidents of all nationally-organized Women's Societies in Canada as the official channel through which relief comforts shall be sent to the Canadian War Contingent Association (through the courtesy of the Canadian Red Cross Society,) and that the Canadian War Contingent Association be requested to address all appeals for field comforts to the secretary of that committee, 77 King St. Toronto."

It was also resolved that a cablegram should be sent to Hon. George H. Perley deprecating any individual appeals from members of the Canadian War Contingent Association to the public of Canada, for money or supplies, independently of the Canadian Women's organization actively established in carrying on that work.

Venezuela—Greatest of Cattle Lands

Venezuela's vast plains and river valleys offer unlimited ranges and excellent pasturage. About 1518 Christopher Rodriguez sent the first horned cattle into the llanos, where they have increased to probably two million head. Lack of proper Government support and initiative prevents ten times as many cattle occupying the vast llanos. If one observe the piles of hides, dried or dry-salted, crowning the river bank of San Fernando, and scanning the vast plains of this region, watch the great herds swim the wide reach of its river, he will understand why the State of Apure is the greatest breeding-ground for cattle and the reason for San Fernando being its capital. Many of the great herds have gone to provide, literally, sinews of war—gobbled up by revolutionary bands; in peace cattle owners suffer from marauders and a "extract of beef" government policy. Almost every important industry under a military government naturally. "Here," said one Venezuelan, "the Government is a store," and he is not least among its profitable wares. In San Fernando, beef is sold on the hoof at slightly over three or a half cents a pound to the Government, at eight cents to be butchered.


"Is it more than \$16,000 a year?" he was asked. "It is," said the pitcher, but added that the figures should be announced by Mr. Weeghman.

Immediately after their conference, Tinker took a train for Chicago and Johnson motored back to his farm.


