## THE CONSERVATION OF COAL IN CANADA

Canada's dependence on the United States for its supply of anthracite coal is a point strikingly indicated in the report just issued by the Commission of Conservation, on the "Conservation of Coal in Canada." Practically all of the most populous portion of Canada lying between Montreal Que., and Moose Jaw Sask., relies solely on the United States for its supply of anthracite coal. Further there are indications that the United States may, in the comparatively near future prohibit the export of anthracite and as the only anthracite deposits thus far discovered in Canada, are confined to the area near Banff Alta., it is of great importance that suitable substitutes be found as soon as possible.

Such a situation makes it clear that Canada should carefully husband her coal resources and so far as possible check all wasteful methods of mining and handling coal. With this end in view the report suggests greatly needed changes in the form of coal mine leases the provisions of which should be carefully enforced by a competent engineering authority. This would go far towards preventing the careless practices followed at present in many coal mines. In addition to this, it is urged that the government should carry on investigations with a view of determining the suitability of slack and low grade coals for use in gas producers for generating power, and their adaptability for the manufacture of briquettes for domestic use. By utilizing these inferior products in this way, not only would there be less waste, but the value of the public coal lands would be considerably increased.

Again it is pointed out that central power stations situated in the vicinity of many of the lignite fields of Western Canada could develop electric power for transmission to neighboring manufacturing centres. This would mean a great saving especially in the case of lignites that will not stand shipping to any considerable distance.

The experience of Great Britain, the United States and other countries in the manufacture of coal briquettes is given in some detail, and the methods adapted to conditions in Canada are indicated.

Comparisons are being made between the bee-hive ovens and the by-products ovens for the coking of coal and the economies effected by the latter over the former are clearly presented.

In addition short descriptions are given of the principal coal mines in Canada, as well as of the by-product coke oven plant of the Algoma Steel Co., at Sault Ste Marie, Ont. The report is well illustrated by means of maps, diagrammatic sketches and half-tone engravings, and should prove of great value not only to those directly engaged in coal mining but to all who are interested in the economic welfare of the Dominion.

Montreal, April 22—Sir Thomas Shaughnessy, president of the C.P.R. who is in Winnipeg, is quoted as commenting on the break in C.P.R. shares today to 195 as follows:—

"So far as the shareholders of the C.P.R. are concerned they are in just as good position as when the stock is selling at 195 as they were when the stock sold at 283. The prospects are just as promising now as then. There is no more prospect of a reduction of the dividends now than then. There is no more reason why the stock should sell at 195 than why it should sell at 283.

"C. P. R. is a speculative international stock, and the outbreak in of hostilities in Mexico no doubt, accounts to some extent for the break. The earnings of the company have been less but there has been no decrease to warrant the present market situation.

The only danger to which C. P. R. is exposed is the general collapse in the trade and commerce of Canada. The success of the company is bound up with the success of the country, and of the financial and commercial soundness of Canada, there is no doubt in the minds of good judges."

## AFFAIRS OF THE HEWSON COMPANY

Amherst, April 22—A general meeting of the shareholders and bondholders of Hewson Pure Wool and Textile Company was held at the offices of the company, yesterday, to hear the report of the committee appointed at the January meeting to examine into the financial condition of the company and to make recommendations to maintain the industry as a growing concern.

The recommendations as to the future of the industry as printed in the Globe on Tuesday are to the effect that if the present common stock were wiped out, the preferred stock holders given common stock and the present bondholders consent to take preferred stock, it would be possible to have a new bond issue of \$150,000 which would provide sufficient capital to give the company a fresh start.

It is doubtful if the bondholders will agree to the proposition. The report gave a general criticism of the management and there is no doubt that the men who stand to lose are highly dissatisfied with conditions as they exist, and several of those interested intimated that an action would be brought against the directors and against the banking house that made the arrangement to recover their losses.
