ACTIVITY IN MILITIA CIRCLES FOR SUSSEX CAMP

71st York Regt and 28th New Brunswick Dragoons Recruiting in This Vicinity--New Officials for Both Corps

Activity is being displayed by the local militia units in preparation for the annual training, which will begin at Sussex a week from next Tuesday. The 71st York Regt. and the 28th New Brunswick Dragoons are recruiting for the various units assigned to this section of the province and No. VIII Field Ambulance, with headquarters at St. John, will draw some officers and men from this section also.

New officers have joined all these corps from this vicinity. Dr. W. H. Irvine has taken a commission as lieutenant in No. VIII Field Ambulance. Mr. Arthur Coldwell of this city, has applied for a lieutenantcy in the 71st Regt. Mr. E. Lounsbury, also of this city, has taken a commission as lieutenant in the 28th Dragoons. Mr. H. E. Colings of Marysville, will go to camp with the 71st Regt. as a supernumerary provisional lieutenant.

Uniforms and equipment is being issued at the local armory to the companies of the 71st Regt. and preliminary drill is being done by D company. Collar badges of the same pattern as the cap badges have been issued to the regiment, being a new feature.

The usual pressing arrangements have been made by the officers of the 71st Regt and 28th Dragoons. George Colwell of this city will be caterer for the Dragoons and John H. Parsons for the 71st Regt the mess committee of the latter corps having found

CENTENARIAN CELEBRATES BIRTHDAY

Levi Richardson One Hundred and Three Years Ago Today--Remarkable Old Man Residing In This City

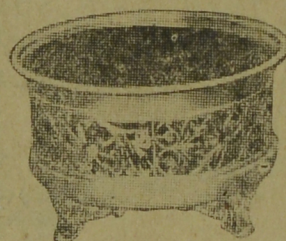
Levi Richardson Fredericton's oldest resident celebrated his own hundred and third birthday today. Mr. Richardson in spite of his advanced age is in a remarkably good state of health being able to be about and attending service at the Methodist Church each Sunday. Mr. Richardson's faculties are not greatly affected by his great age and his memory of events of his early life is clear and distinct. Like almost all people of extreme age his recollection of events and things of the distant past is much better than that of those of recent times.

Mr. Richardson makes his home with his son-in-law Charles D. Young, 338 Westmorland Street. He is a native of St. Andrew's and resided in Charlotte county for the greater part of his life running a farm at Lawrence Station in the neighborhood of St. Stephen. Upon leaving the farm he went to Houlton where he made his home with a married daughter. Upon her death six years ago he came to live with Mr. and Mrs. Young.

It is doubtful if New Brunswick has an older resident or any of similar age who is in so good state of health.

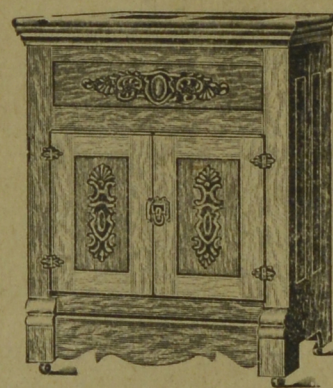
