NORTHUMBERLAND MEMBER ASKS FOR INFORMATION

Mr. Swim Presents Resolutions Passed by the County Council and wants to know What the Government is Going to do About It--Provincial Hospital Tax Condemned

The following notices of enquiries were submitted by Mr. Swim in the Legislature on Friday:

NOTICE OF INQUIRY FOR TUESDAY NEXT, MR. SWIM

Has the Government or the Premier received from the secretary treasurer of Northumberland County a copy of the following Resolution passed at the January 1914 sitting of the Municipal Council of the County of Northumberland:

"Whereas the road between the parishes of Rogersville and Nelson, known as the Baenaby River Road, is the only highway communication between the growing parish of Rogersville and the parish of Nelson, and the road leading from Rogersville to the Power Settlement in the Parish of Glenelg.

PAY OF JURORS

Has the Government or the Premier received from the secretary treasurer of Northumberland County a copy of the following resolution, passed at the January 1914 sitting of the Municipal Council of the County of Northumberland:

"Resolved that in the opinion of this Council the Grand and Petit Jurors while attending court should receive two dollars per day and mileage and that the secretary treasurer forward a copy of this resolution to the premier and local members.

If so, what reply if any has been made thereto? It is the intention of the Government to so amend the "Jury Act" as to authorize the payment to jurors of the amount suggested in said resolution?

Has the Government or the Premier received from the secretary treasurer of Northumberland County a copy of the following resolution, passed at the January 1914 sitting of the Municipal Council of the County of Northumberland:

"Whereas from time immemorial the Municipal Council has appointed the Commissioners of Highways and whereas this present Government has taken that right away by the Highway Act of 1913.

And whereas certain monies are by direct taxation collected from the people towards the maintenance of Highways and the council has no say in the spending of the said monies or any control over the supervisors of Roads not even a detailed statement of how the said monies are expended resigning to the council.

Therefore resolved that this council ask the Government to so amend the said Highway Act that this Council will have some control over the monies and also give them power to appoint the Supervisors of Roads."

If so, what reply if any has been made thereto? Does the government purpose promoting legislation complying with the request of the Municipal Council as expressed in said resolution?

MURDERER DORR TO PAY DEATH PENALTY

Boston, Mass., March 21--Unless an eleventh-hour commutation of sentence comes from the governor's council, William A. Dorr of Stockton, Cal., the convicted murderer of Geo. E. Marsh, will be put to death in the electric chair in Charlestown prison during the week beginning at midnight tonight.

Marsh who was an aged and wealthy soap manufacturer of Lynn, was found dead on the Lynn marshes on April 12, 1912. The evidence showed that he had been shot while riding in an automobile and his body thrown into the marshes. A week after the crime Dorr was arrested at his home in Stockton, Cal., and brought to Boston in a state of collapse.

Dorr lived in Stockton at the home of his aunt, Miss Orpha Marsh, adopted daughter of a brother of Geo. E. Marsh, who was custodian of a trust from which she received an allowance with the understanding that the entire fund would come to her on the death of George E. Marsh. The prosecution claimed that this fund furnished the motive for the murder, as Dorr believed himself to be the beneficiary under Miss Marsh's will. Evidence at the trial showed that Dorr had been in Lynn for a week or so before the murder and had been in conference with Marsh. There was also introduced a diary belonging to Dorr and which contained entries about "doing the job" and "glad it is all over."

Dorr admitted killing Marsh, but said he acted in self defense when Marsh attacked him after he had represented a remark of Marsh's concerning Miss Marsh.

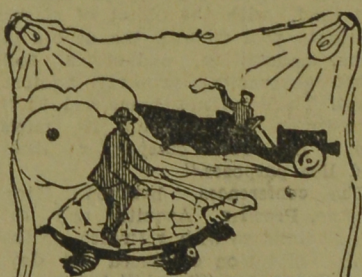

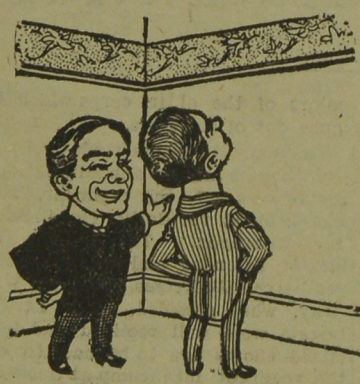
