COUNCIL WANTS POOL-ROOM BYLAW PROPERLY ENFORCED

ent sections of bylaw 19, relating to the conduct of Billiard, Pool-Rooms or Bowling Alleys, be printed and issued to each licensee in the city with instructions that these rules and regulations be hung up in the different rooms or alleys and strictly adhered to or license will be cancelled.

POLICE COMMISSION'S RESOLUTION.

The city clerk then read a resolution passed yesterday at the meeting of the Police Commission to the effect that the commissioners considered pool-rooms detrimental to the well-being of the youth of the city inasmuch as they caused the expenditure of hard-earned money and also that the commissioners were of the opinion that pool-rooms should not be licensed.

Ald. Reid thought that in view of the resolution of the Police Commission steps should be taken to repeal the bylaw licensing pool-rooms.

Ald. Osborne said that all pool-rooms should be closed or else applicant with a respectable record should be given a license.

ALD. LEMONT OBJECTS.

Ald. Lemont thought a resolution of the Police Commission should have weight. If the commission had evidence that the stringent bylaw governing pool-rooms were being violated it should take steps to have the bylaw enforced. He would not favor the repeal of the bylaw. A pool-room in itself was not objectionable. Pool was recognized as an amusement of high class.

Ald. Everett was like-minded. He knew however, that the bylaw was violated in the fact that minors younger than seventeen years were permitted to frequent such pool-rooms.

SPECIAL MEETING.

Ald. Ebbett brought up the matter of the proposition of the Fredericton

Gaslight Company re street lighting. Ald. Wilkinson suggested that as there were three absentees a special meeting be called for the purpose of considering the matter.

On the motion of Ald. Ebbett it was decided to hold a special meeting on Wednesday, June 10.

MUSIC COMMITTEE REPORT.

For the Music Committee Ald. Lemont reported that all three local bands had accepted the terms to give open-air concerts. Two concerts already had been given and five or six others had been arranged. Fredericton was going to have good concerts. The best band was to get the most money. A spirit of friendly rivalry had been created. He had noticed that The Gleaner had announced that the Fredericton Brass Band was not to play Wednesday night. He knew nothing of any postponement and as far as he knew the concert was to take place.

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION.

Ald. Everett moved the adoption of the following resolution: Whereas This council has learned that it is the intention of the Board of School Trustees of the City of Fredericton to inaugurate a more advanced system of vocational education for boys, in addition to the Sloyd work already taught and also provide for teaching domestic science to girls, the beginning to be made when the completion of the Smythe Street School renders room available in the present High School.

Therefore Resolved That this council heartily commends the project and pledges itself to support the Board of School Trustees in bringing it to a successful issue.

Further Resolved That a copy of this resolution be sent to the secretary of the Board of School Trustees.

Ald. Lemont strongly supported the resolution which was passed.

Mayor Mitchell was strongly in favor of the proposal to furnish vocational education and spoke at some length on the subject.

The council then adjourned.

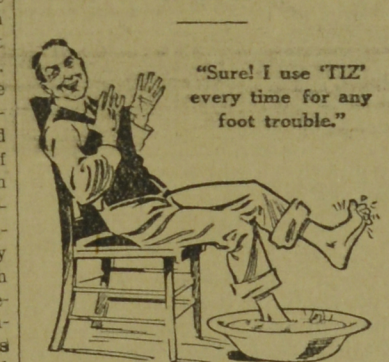
To The Editor of The Mail, Fredericton, N. B.

R. for the comfort of those who are forced to patronize the early accommodation between Fredericton and Chatham. On Tuesday the 3rd of June I bought a ticket on this train paying 10 cents less than the regular commercial fare between Fredericton and Boiestown. There was only one seating space in the car which was utilized for all classes and requirements of travel and this unseated in hardwood seats. Both ladies and gentlemen are forced to travel by this train. Just fancy Mr. Editor, a lady being forced by the management of the people's railway instituting a provision that forces our mother's, sister's or wives to travel in a car that is not only a smoker but one of the meanest types found on any road in the Maritime Provinces. Now, Mr. Editor we don't purpose submitting to any such rot as is being practiced by the management on this branch from Fredericton to Chatham. The passenger car placed for the service of the public Wednesday morning, June 3, was not fit for a stock car say nothing about the ordinary requirements of a public who pay the price for transport.

The public pays the salary of men who draw their money as inspectors of car windows. There was not a window in that car that the rain did not come through. It had only one apartment for ladies and men who smoke. We are paying enough for a manager whose just duty is to provide for the comfort of people who travel. We are entering this protest

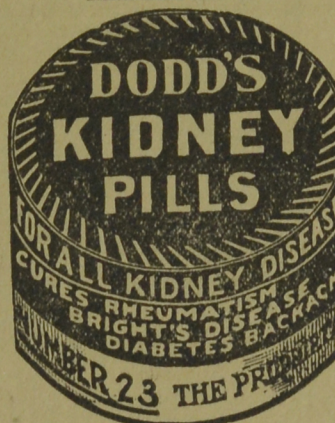
