### CARSON'S "ARMY" PARADES IN BELFAST

London, April 25—A test mobilization of Ulster volunteers in Belfast, last night, filled many nervous citizens with apprehension. The parade of nearly thirty thousand men created great excitement and many rumors were rife.

It was recalled that the last general mobilization took place on Thursday March 19, which was the date of the so-called government plot but this, however, was a mere coincidence. The men were summoned for last night's mobilization on very short notice and were also instructed not to carry arms but despite this fact, extraordinary rumors were afloat, concerning an intended raid upon the post office. Another rumor was that the heaviest consignment of war material, since its importation was banned was to be landed.

### THE SHRINERS' TEMPLE DEDICATED

St. Louis, Mo., April 25—Prominent members of the Mystic Shrine from many parts of the country came to St. Louis today and helped to dedicate the new Moolah Temple in this city. Imperial Potentate William W. Irwin, of Wheeling, W. Va., was in charge of the ceremonies. The new building cost a quarter of a million dollars and is one of the most magnificent temples owned by the order anywhere in the country.

### PRINCESS MARY IS SEVENTEEN

London, April 25—Princess Mary, the only daughter of King George Queen Mary, celebrated her seventeenth birthday today. Many presents were received at Buckingham Palace from all the members of the British royal family and from relatives on the continent. In token of the anniversary flags were displayed on all the Government buildings today and at noon the customary salutes were fired in St. James's Park and at Windsor.

### RADIUM TO CURE DEAFNESS

Berlin, April 25—The merits of radium in the treatment of deafness and other affections of the ear will be threshed out at a congress or European ear specialists which is to begin its sessions tomorrow in Cologne. Eminent specialists of Germany, France and other countries have been experimenting for a long time to determine the value of radium and mesothorium in the treatment of ear troubles. Some of the expert members claim to have met with decided success, while others are reported to be sceptical regarding the value of the treatment.

### BLACK FOX COMPANY HAS HEAVY LOSS

Charlottetown, April 24—There was a big sensation in fox circles today when it became known that the Charles Dalton Company lost twelve litters within a short time. As the litters average about four each, the total loss is about \$300,000, the worst individual loss in the history of the industry in this province.

The directors in publishing a statement of the occurrence state, that everything was going along perfectly, and a record year was expected. On April 20, a litter of pups showed out, and as these were not the first expected, it was wondered why they should appear before the others. On investigating a den in which pups over a month old should have been, it was found empty. On looking into three others, dens in which pups were known to have been previous to the first litter, the same results were found. The general manager, Hon. Charles Dalton was then consulted, and it was decided that every den in which pups were known to have been born should be over hauled. Being sure of fourteen litters this number of boxes was opened and only one litter besides the first litter was found.

The directors were immediately called together and it was unanimously agreed that for the interests of the shareholders and other interests connected with the company the losses should be made public without delay.

Every care possible has been given so these foxes, and the management of the ranch was minutely required into and not a flaw was found. It was proved by catching the females that the young had been sucking their mothers, and by the conditions of the females it is surmised that the young had all been lost at one time; and it is thought that one of the many storms, either snow or thunder, which have occurred since the pups were born, may have so frightened and excited the parents as to cause them to carry the pups out and bury them. But this is only a surmise, as nothing definite is known except that the pups were born and have disappeared since.

There are still some pens to be examined and the company expect to pay five to fifteen per cent dividend this year.

### NOTABLE WEDDING IN WASHINGTON

Washington, D.C., April 25—Official and resident society in the national capital, the army contingent in particular, was well represented at the wedding this afternoon of Miss C. Frances Brooks, daughter of Col. John C. W. Brooks and granddaughter of Gen. John M. Wilson, and Edward Cunningham Bergner Fletcher of Philadelphia. The marriage ceremony was performed in St. Thomas's Church and was followed by a large reception at the Wilson home in Massachusetts avenue.

### FRENCH PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS

Paris, April 25—General elections to the Chamber of Deputies will take place tomorrow, with second ballots two weeks hence in constituencies where candidates fail to obtain the regulation majorities. The campaign which closed today with the last appeals of the candidates has attracted far more than ordinary attention. Of late years the French people have shown an increasing tendency to assign a smaller place in their lives to politics. But the home events of the past few months, particularly the Caillaux-Calmates tragedy and the investigation of the Rochette affair, have served to rouse the people from their apathy and in consequence a very heavy poll is expected tomorrow.

The annual parade of New York's "finest," otherwise the police parade, is always well worth seeing. This year the parade is to have several added attractions. In true circus style the street parade will be followed by the big show, which will have nearly all the attractions usually seen under the big white tents with the exception of the menagerie. The show will take place on the broad plaza in front of the Public Library. Here the city officials and thousands of citizens will gather to see athletes.

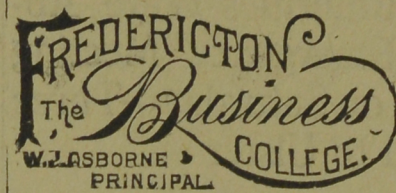

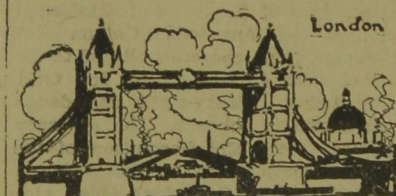
