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## A POVERTY-STRICKEN PARTY

"I wish to say, however, before I sit down, that we on this side of the House are not hoisting any signals of distress. We are not asking for any quarter. We are in the best of cheer and we are quite willing to bide our time and take what the future has in store for us as a party. We are confident of one thing and that is that the Conservative party was never less formidable as a fighting force than they are today. They need settled beliefs and a moral issue of some kind just about as badly as any party ever did. 'Canadians cannot build ships.' 'Canadians are not big enough to trade with their nearest neighbor on equal terms.' 'Hard times is the only cure for high prices.' 'Soup kitchens must needs come.' 'Let bad enough alone.' These are not inspiring battle cries, Mr. Speaker. The truth of the matter is, the leaders of the Conservative party at the present time have no convictions on any of the great questions that are now before the country. No man can tell what their permanent naval policy is to be. No man can tell what their policy is on so important a question as the British Preference. No man can state what their policy is on the reduction of the duties on agricultural implements or the abolition of the duty on wheat. They agree on one thing and one thing alone, and that is reckless expenditure—putting the screws on the consumer—wringing all you can out of the people and hand it over to the great Shogun to spend it where he can get the most votes for the Conservative party—let us eat and drink for tomorrow we die. An end to all this must come sooner or later, and the sooner it comes the better for the people of Canada."—Mr. J. H. Sinclair, M.P., in the House of Commons.

## STRATHCONA'S ADVICE

In his last annual message to Canada, the late Lord Strathcona advised caution all round and said:

"Canadians should be more careful than ever of the position of the Dominion in the financial market. Greater regard must be paid to the investor than is always shown to him."

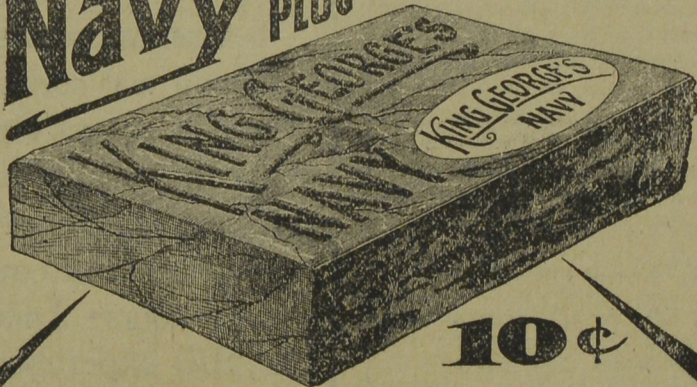
This admonition is timely, coming after the last Canadian loan of \$20,000,000 at 4 per cent. issued at 97 of which 87 per cent. was left on the hands of the underwriters and which was described in the British press as the most spectacular failure on the financial market for many years. It was the failure of this loan which led The London Post to criticize Hon. Mr. White's financial methods as calculated to hide from the investors Canada's real financial position.

The result of the Borden government's neglect of Lord Strathcona's advice is that Canada's rate of interest has gone up from 3½ per cent. to 4½ per cent. Where the last Fielding loan at 3½ per cent. stood 6 points above corresponding Western Australia stock, now Western Australia 4 per cent. recently issued at 97, stand at a premium of 2, while an exactly similar Canadian loan is at ½ discount. Canada badly needs the experienced hands of a Fielding to take care of her finances before they become wrecked by White and the extravagance of his colleagues.

Moncton Transcript: One of the excuses made by the Hon. Mr. Cochrane for cancelling the suburban trains was that some of them were merely summer trains. Train No. 69, a suburban train leaving Halifax for Windsor Junction at 23.15 o'clock it is said has been running all the year around for twenty years past. Twenty years continuous running of a train is a pretty fair record for the Tory party to come in and break. The truth of the matter is that the Tory party is seeking to dismantle the people's railway by making it unpopular.

## SAVE THE BOY

Take the money received from liquor licenses and spend it on public clubs, baths, gymnasiums and playgrounds, and the boy will have a chance. A clear, clean mind in a strong, clean body is the best safeguard against dissipation."

St. John Times: When Hon. William Pugsley was well he was only worthy of abuse from the Tory press. Now that he is ill and unable to be in parliament the Ottawa correspondent of the Standard writes: "The loss to the Liberals is serious. In fact his absence largely accounts for the apathy which has been shown by the opposition this session. His was the genius that framed most of the attack during the last two sessions."

Every true Canadian must regret that ill health has compelled Hon. William Pugsley, M. P., to absent himself from parliament during the present session at Ottawa. Dr. Pugsley the Liberal leader in New Brunswick has been recognized ever since taking a place in the Dominion Parliament as a man of outstanding ability who has made his influence felt in federal affairs. His bitterest foes, journalistic and otherwise, grudgingly have admitted the same.

Booze and its usual attendants appear to be prominent adjuncts of the Conservative party all over the Dominion. A revenue cruiser was employed to transport liquor in the bye-election in Victoria County, N. S. At Chateaugay and Huntington, Que., a Dominion official was employed to distribute liquor in bye-election campaigns. In York, N. B., the Ministerial Association has protested by resolution against the domination of the liquor interests in the selection of a Conservative candidate.

Hockey specials and a Saturday night train do not satisfy the people of Marysville who want a decent train service between that town and Fredericton. H. F. McLeod, M. P., probably will realize that when he reads the petition forwarded to Ottawa by Mayor Gray, York's member already is discovering how heavy is his influence in the federal political sphere.

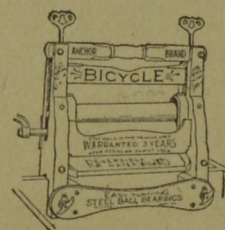

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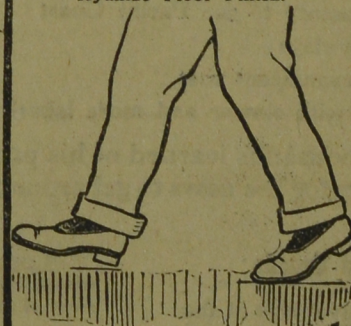
