Much Depends on Tonight's Hockey Game

PUT U. N. B. THROUGH
HARD WORKOUT

College Team Shows Signs of Improvement Under His Instruction
---Acadia Plays Here Feb. 12

The U.N.B. hockey team held their regular practise yesterday afternoon. Mike Murphy was on hand and showed the team a few "trick plays" and explained to them the real value of combination, which is one of the most important elements of the seven-men game. Mike has taken a deep interest in the team since he started to coach and with the material that is on hand the many followers of the team expect to see them play some real good hockey this season as the result of his coaching. The team has but two short weeks left before they play their first game here with Acadia, on February 12, and it will be necessary for them to work hard as the other colleges are reported as having strong teams to compete for the trophy.

BIG ATHLETIC MEET IN CHICAGO

Chicago, Ill., Feb. 5—An army of athletes, representing the best amateur performers in the Central A.A. U. territory, is on its way to Chicago to take part in the twentieth annual indoor meet of the First Regiment Athletic Association. The meet promises to be the largest of the year in this section of the country. Owing to the large number of participants the programme will cover two days. Tomorrow the preliminary events will be run off. These will be followed on Saturday by the open and track events. Most interest centers in the relay races, in which teams representing Chicago, Illinois, Notre Dame and other big universities of the Middle West will compete for the championship honors.

Four-Cornered Tie in N. B. H. L. Still is Possible--
Marysville Stars Did Not Turn up This Morning in Fredericton-- Big Crowd Expected to Turn out For Game ---Fredericton Will Have Same Team

Owing to the fact that Chatham defeated Campbellton on Tuesday night the league standing has taken a different appearance. It gives both Chatham and Fredericton a good chance for the laurels. Marysville still have a chance to make a four corner tie by winning the two games they have still to play, providing Fredericton defeat Campbellton and lose only one game to Chatham.

Should Marysville defeat Fredericton tonight it will give Fredericton a slim chance of winning and will also put them at the bottom of the heap. Likewise if Fredericton should win they will be tie with Chatham as league leaders. Therefore the game at Chatham on February the 11th would be one of the deciding games of the league as a defeat for either team would be disastrous.

It was stated in The Mail last night that Marysville will probably have two new faces on the line-up. It generally is stated by Marysville

people that they are trying to get a star forward and a goal-tender for the game here tonight. Manager Tommy Lynch of the Fredericton club will probably line his team up as he did against Campbellton.

Campbellton's chances do not look as bright as they did earlier in the season but they still have an excellent chance of winning as they play their last game on home ice where they have yet to be defeated. If Marysville complete arrangements with the players in question they will in all probability give Fredericton a hard game. Consideration must be given to the fact, however, that in the Campbellton game Fredericton were practically a new team never having played together before, and that during the intervening time they have been practicing regularly. It is a recognized fact however, that Fredericton is weak at centre ice and it would be wise for the management to keep in mind the "horse" and the "Barn Door."

Washington, D.C., Feb. 4—Double appeals in the so-called tap line cases, in which the Commerce Court decided against the Interstate Commerce Commission, came up for hearing in the Supreme Court of the United States today. The government hopes for an early decision in the cases, owing to their importance and the fact that they have been dragging through the courts for several years.

The tap line cases involve the rights and privileges of sawmill railroads in the southwest, particularly Arkansas, Louisiana, Missouri and Texas, running back from trunk railroads to lumber camps. The point at issue is whether such lines shall be considered as common carriers and be subject to the same regulations as to rates and other matters as the regular railroads. The development of the lumber business in various sections of the country is said to depend in large measure on the outcome of the litigation.
