



READY FOR WAR

Germany Has a Mass of Hoarded Treasure in Reserve

In the Julius Tower of Spandau, a Growing In Attendance Prussian fortress eight miles from Next Term Opens April 1st. Berlin, a vast quantity of specie and \$30,000,000 in gold are stored and held in reserve, ready for immediate use should Germany go to war,

Needless to say, elaborate pre cautions are taken to guard this mass of hoarded treasures. The gold coins are stored in chests, piled one upon another, in rooms, to which access only is possible by passing through three doors, each fitted with several locks.

Each of these doors weighs a ton and is made of steel, with an oak core; whilst each of the keys is held by a different Government cificial, so that it is impossible for any one of these officials to gain admission to the treasure chambers unaccompanied.




