HOUSE PASSED ADDRESS AFTER BRIEF DISCUSSION

a fertile district and valuable lumber lands, the development of which had been handicapped hitherto for lack of adequate transportation facilities. The Minto Railway, which the Government had also been instrumental in bringing into operation was serving a district which suffered for many years for want of such convenience. It had also opened up the coal mines, which are proving a source of considerable revenue to the province, and providing cheaper fuel. As long as the Government proceeded with its policy of railway development, forest conservation, extension of mining industries and adding to the revenue it would have his heartiest support and also, he believed, of the people of the province.

THE SECONDER.

Mr. Grimmer, in seconding the address, said that he desired to express his appreciation of the honor conferred upon him in his selection for the performance of this somewhat important duty. He wished to say in starting out that he had had very little experience in public speaking, and for that reason as well as because of his being a new member, he felt that he could very properly crave the kindest indulgence of the House. He thought it a matter for congratulation that His Honor had been able to present so gratifying a picture of the prosperity of the province and that matters foreshadowed as likely to claim attention of the Legislature at its present session are of so important a character.

Every member of the House must be gratified to learn that as the result of the philanthropy of the late L. P. Fisher it has been possible to erect in Woodstock an agricultural and vocational school which had been placed at the disposal of the government without cost to the province. The importance of this school to the farmers of New Brunswick could scarcely be estimated. Opportunities will be afforded for a course of instruction which will cover many subjects of interest to the farmer and which if carried from the school to the farm cannot but produce beneficial results. Before 1908 there was little interest displayed by the government in the farmers of the province and the aid which the late government claimed to be giving to the farmers failed to produce the results which might naturally be expected from intelligent effort along this line. Since the present government came into power, however, a wonderful change had been brought about and throughout the province more interest had been developed by the farmers adopting more up-to-date agricultural methods and more effective working of their farms than ever before.

The County of Charlotte, which he had the honor to represent, might be taken as an example. Within the past four or five years the old agricultural fair which had served the purpose of distributing a few dollars to the few farmers who could be induced to take any interest in the work, had been replaced by an annual exhibition of agricultural products which would compare favorably with that in any other agricultural district in Canada or the New England States. The new interest had been awakened and the results were evident in improved stock, improved methods of farming and increased crops of better quality than hitherto.

The prompt action taken by the government in meeting the conditions arising from the embargo placed against potato shipments from Canada into the United States, was but one instance of the energy and activity of the Agricultural Department in meeting the requirements of the great farming industry and he expressed the hope that the measure foreshadowed in the speech, looking toward the eradication of disease in potatoes, would bring the results that are confidently anticipated.

While every county in the province had participated in the prosperity which had prevailed during the year, it was gratifying to be reminded that the farmers had been favored with good crops and satisfactory prices, and that agriculture throughout the province was in a sound, healthy condition; that the work of the lumbermen had been attended with success and that the province generally had experienced fewer unfavorable conditions because of the financial stringency which had so generally prevailed throughout the commercial world than almost any other portion

of the continent. The prosperity which had attended the great basic industries of the province had not been confined to these alone. Everywhere signs of optimism which had taken so strong a hold on the people within the last few years showed no signs of abatement. Great industries were projected and in course of development and if results were in any way commensurate with the prospects of advancement, New Brunswick, which for so many years had merely marked time, was surely entering upon a period of commercial and industrial expansion such as had never before been experienced.

FISHERIES CLAIM.

The settlement of the fishery claims which had been outstanding between the provincial and federal governments for upwards of thirty years, was a tribute to the persistency and ability which had always been displayed by the government in standing for the rights of the province

WAS WARM FRIEND OF NEW BRUNSWICK

Dr. D. W. Greene, Noted Big Game Hunter Passes Away at Dayton, Ohio

Dr. D. W. Green, an American sportsman who has made many hunting trips to the Miramichi, died suddenly a short time ago at his home in Dayton, Ohio. He had gone to the railway station to meet some friends and expired while sitting in his automobile. Dr. Green first heard of New Brunswick about twelve years ago through some advertising matter which had been distributed by the Fredericton Tourist Association at a Chicago sportsman's show. He visited the province the following year and enjoyed a successful hunt for big game at the Sisters' Lake with Mr. Beniah Norrad as guide. For eight years following he was almost an annual visitor and on each occasion brought a party of friends with him on one occasion the number being twelve. He procured a lot of excellent photos and delivered several illustrated lectures on the province in his home city. At the time of the St. Louis Fair, Dr. Green and other Dayton sportsmen took Guide Norrad on a trip to the middle west as their guest. He accompanied them to the World's Fair and also visited them at Dayton.

Dr. Green was recognized as one of the most eminent oculists in the United States. He was on the staff of the National Soldiers' Home at Dayton and enjoyed a large private practice. A few years ago he journeyed to Egypt and successfully removed a cataract from the eye of the Khedive, receiving for his services a substantial fee. He had many friends in Fredericton who will regret to learn of his death.
