

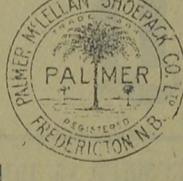

SOUTHAMPTON MAN CALLED TO HIS REWARD

Southampton, Dec. 8.—Mrs. Maria R. Fox, relict of the late John W. Fox, died at her home here on Thursday, the 3rd inst., in the ninety-seventh year of her age.

She was born in Jacksontown, Carleton county, on May 6th, 1818, and therefore was exactly ninety-six years six months and twenty-seven days old. She was the daughter of the late Samuel Freeman, who settled in this country during the Revolutionary war. She could distinctly remember when Woodstock consisted of only two or three small huts and one small store. Upper Woodstock (then called Hard Scrabble) was only two or three miles from her home.

Her home here has always been among the most hospital in the province and no stranger, with or without money, ever went hungry from her door.

Her husband died forty-eight years ago in Houlton, Me., where he had gone on business. He left a family of nine children, the youngest only one year old. With commendable pride and great industry Mrs. Fox fought the battle of life and brought up her young family until all of them have made good citizens.

Six children survive her, all of whom attended her funeral. These are: Amasa C., with whom she lived, and who gave her the greatest care; Samuel B., of Temperance Vale; John W., who lives near the homestead; Mrs. William Munroe of Lower Southampton, Mrs. Amos Freeman of Hartford, Carleton county, and Mrs. Jas. T. Martin, wife of the ex-mayor of Campbell Settlement, York county.

The funeral, which was largely attended, was held in the United Baptist church here. Rev. Mr. Rutledge officiated. He stated that when the deceased was sixteen years of age she joined the church. The conductor was Mr. G. A. Grant and the pall-bearers were Frank Brooks, A. E. Farnham, Wooster Cronkwhite and W. K. Oldham.

To this conference, which meets in Amherst on the 17th inst., all Maritime citizens interested in the development of the Canadian East will be cordially welcomed.

It can readily be understood that it was a matter of impossibility for the committee charged with the organization work to get in personal touch with all those whom it is desired should attend this important gathering. Those who sympathize with the movement, whether as private citizens or as representatives of varied interests or organizations are heartily invited to attend the deliberations of the conference.

All who propose to attend this conference are strongly urged to arrive in Amherst on the evening of the 16th so that they will be able to attend all the sessions.

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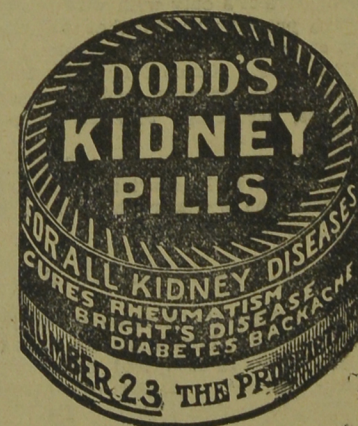
