HEAVY VOTE
EXPECTED AT
MONDAY'S ELECTION

Ballot is Smaller Than Usual---Polling Officers Sworn in by Mayor This Morning---Campaign Has Been Very Quiet

A heavy vote is expected to be brought out on Monday when the annual civic election for Mayor and Aldermen will take place. About sixteen hundred voters are eligible to cast their ballots and it is probable that a large proportion of that number will exercise the franchise. Chief interest centres about the Mayoralty election on account of the connection between the office of Mayor and the police commission. Both Ald. Moses Mitchell and Ald. W.E. Patrell the candidates in the field, have canvassed carefully.

In the Aldermanic election there are contests in only three wards four Aldermen having been returned by acclamation. The candidates are:

St. Ann's Ward, —Ald. Fred H. Everett, Ald. John J. Weddall, A. B. Kitchen.

Queen's Ward—Ald. W. J. Osborne, James M. Lemont, Dougald McCallister, A. Edgar Hanson.

King's Ward—Ald. W. G. Clark, John A. Reid, George McKnight.

The officers, clerks, scrutineers and constables who will be on duty at the various polls were sworn in this morning by His Worship Mayor Hooper.

Four polls will be at the City Hall for No. 1 Division and three at the Court House, for No. 2. Polls will open at 9 a. m. and close at 4 p. m.

CLERKS APPOINTED
FOR TWO COUNTIES

Harris G. Fenety Sworn in Today Succeeding Percy A. Guthrie---James T. Sharkey Appointed for Sunbury

Harris G. Fenety, barrister, of this city, this morning was sworn in by His Honor Judge Wilson as clerk of the York County Court. Mr. Fenety enters upon his duties at once. The office of county court clerk for York was vacated some weeks ago, when Percy A. Guthrie, incumbent since 1908, resigned to accept nomination for the provincial House of Assembly.

Mr. Fenety's name has been mentioned in connection with the office of police magistrate of Fredericton as successor to Lt.-Col. J. L. Marsh. His appointment as county court clerk removes him from the list of aspirants to that office. Mr. Fenety has practised law in Fredericton for many years and is a graduate of the University of New Brunswick and of Harvard Law School. He holds the office of registrar of the Divorce Court and is also secretary to the Committee on Agriculture of the House of Assembly.

SUNBURY APPOINTMENT.

James T. Sharkey has been appointed clerk of the Sunbury Court, succeeding the late J. Stewart Campbell. Mr. Sharkey has not been sworn in. Mr. Sharkey is a well-known barrister of Fredericton and is a graduate of Holy Cross University and Boston Law School.
