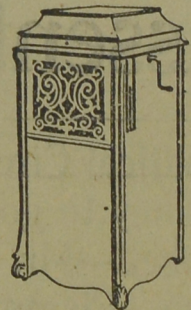

YOUNG IRELAND UNITED OVER HOME RULE

(The Toronto Globe)
Dublin, April 7.—Collaboration on an article in The Daily Citizen by Messrs. Redmond Howard and Henry Carson a nephew and a son respectively of the Nationalist and Ulster leaders, telling the older generation to move or make way for a new and united Nationalist Ireland, is an indication of how the young men are breaking away.

One paragraph reads—"Come, come gentlemen of the older generation, we of the newer have already shaken hands and politics and religion alike can only suffer from these personal recriminations and racial distrusts which are for the most part merely the wreckage of controversies long since dead and grievances long since remedied."

Redmond's nephew is a Unionist. Carson's son is a staunch Home Ruler and is following in the footsteps of his grandfather, a Liberal, and a Home Ruler.

Settlement is in the air. Both sides are jockeying for the best terms. Carson is anxious for peace. The belief is prevalent in well-informed circles that a settlement of the lines of better representation for Ulster is coming.

Redmond is said to be willing to take some Unionists into the first Irish Cabinet. Increased representation as an alternative to exclusion meets with wide acceptance among Unionists outside of Ulster and there is a feeling that the latter will accept the situation once the bill is passed. The isolation of the irreconcilables in the North is more marked as the bill reaches its final stages. The opposition of the Unionists with a stake in the country is frankly conditional upon the possibility of defeating the bill.

A prominent Unionist, who is high up in the councils of his party informed me today that a settlement is hoped for on the third reading, but the general impression of the Nationalists, is that there is no hope of settlement until the bill reaches the Lords, and the Unionists see that its passage is inevitable.

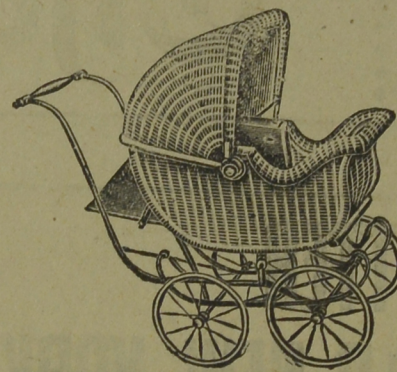

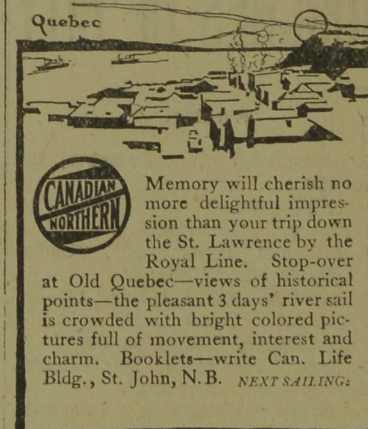
