ports. "Young Gregory died at five o'clock yesterday morning at the New York Hospital and his body was cremated three hours later. His father, broken hearted, at once cancelled the engagement at the Palace and announced the entire troupe would return with the remains on the first outgoing liner.

"The players left England on the Oceanic January 15 and young Gregory fell ill on the way over, owing, it was said, to the roughness of the voyage. On arrival here his condition was such that he was immediately taken to the hospital.

"Young Gregory was born in Liverpool. The elder Gregory, although an American born, had not been here in eight years. The troupe of hoop-rollers in which the son played, had never appeared in this country (United States) and Gregory had looked forward to an extremely prosperous tour."
