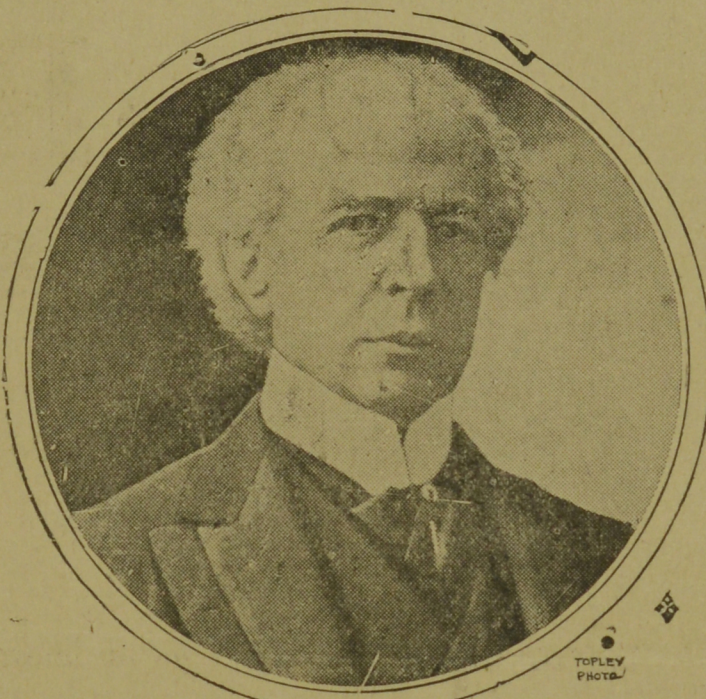
## SIR WILFRID LAURIER AT THE TORONTO FAIR

### POPULARITY OF SIR WILFRID

As Sir Wilfrid Laurier is to speak at the luncheon on Saturday, no reference was made to his presence yesterday by President Oliver. But the fact that Sir Wilfrid was on the grounds kindled cordial interest among thousands, and as he passed out of the Administration Building with Sir William Mulock he received a spontaneous reception from the waiting crowd. One lady greeted the leader of the Opposition with the remark: "Sir Wilfrid, I have loved you since I was knee-high to a grasshopper," and received as her reward a courtly acknowledgment from the

affection as the greatest Canadian.

"Sir Wilfrid Laurier is a magnet," said Mr. John K. Munro, publicity representative of the Canadian National Exhibition. "He brought good luck to the fair, and the best weather conditions this week. How the directors of the association would have relished his presence last week. Now that Sir Wilfrid is to spend the remainder of the week in our midst we are assured of sunny days for the closing of the exhibition."

### GERMANS IN FRANCE

(Continued from page one.)

"HURRIED, IF NOT DISORDERLY"

Gen. Joffe, the French commander-in-chief, pictured the retreat as hurried, if not disorderly, with the Germans abandoning prisoners, wounded, and supplies.

The last Sunday was the darkest day of the war for the allies. The French government emigrated from Paris to Bordeaux in a long procession of motor cars. An attack upon the capital appeared imminent, and the main German force had hammered a huge wedge into France between Paris and Verdun, with its centre some miles south of that line.

The French people trembled with the question whether their army was not a beaten army whether the history of 1870 would repeat itself.

The battle of Marne, which was decided in a week, is regarded by military experts as the most marvellous reversal of roles of two armies known. In their views it appears to have decided the first phase of the war, and to have made possible the plan which the German staff is supposed to have had by smashing the French by one comprehensive stroke, and then turning the bulk of German forces eastward to confront the Russians.

The military experts, however, are still cautious. While realizing the possibility that the German armies may rally and draw a strong defensive line, they recognize also the possibility of the almost complete evacuation of France and Belgium.

Paris announces that the Germans have evacuated Aeneins. The whereabouts of German reinforcements of sixty thousand, reported to be march-

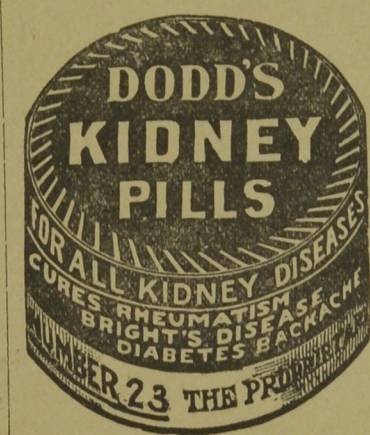
ing south on three roads in that neighborhood, are unknown.
