### REVOLTING STORY REACHES THE CITY FROM MILLVILLE

Young Imbecile who Formerly Resided Here Said to Have Opened a Grave  
---Was Found Unconscious in a Cemetery

One of the worst escapades ever recorded in the history of New Brunswick is reported to have been perpetrated at Millville a few days ago when a young maniac, who formerly resided in this city, dug up a grave in a cemetery a few miles from that place, and attempted to devour the bones of a body.

The details of the shocking incident reached this city on Saturday, and is the general topic of conversation about the city today.

The maniac, who is a young man of about seventeen or eighteen years of age, had always been considered harmless and when he suddenly left his home a few days ago his parents naturally became very anxious regarding his whereabouts. A posse of men was organized and on searching the country for miles the young man was found lying in an unconscious condition beside an open grave in a cemetery a short distance from Millville. The bones of the dead body were strewn upon the ground and the young man's fingers were badly torn and bruised due to the fact that he had dug up the grave with his hands.

It is expected that he will soon be placed in the Provincial Hospital at St. John.

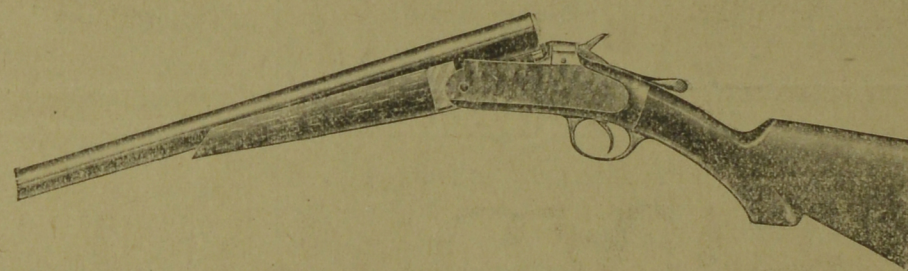
