Montreal, July 9-The celebrated case of Dame Rebecca Chiniqui, wife of Professor Morin of McGill University, against Joseph Begin, publisher of La Croix, which has been dismiss ed on a technicality by the court of revuew, will likely come before the courts again for a rehearing.

As will be remembered, the plaiatiff, who is a daughter of the late ex-priest, "Father" Chiniqui, was awarded three thousand dollars damages against the newspaper in question on account of an alleged libellous article published in La Crclx, but on an appeal being taken to the court of review, the decision of the lower court was upset because the plaintiff had not been properly authorized by her husband to sue.
