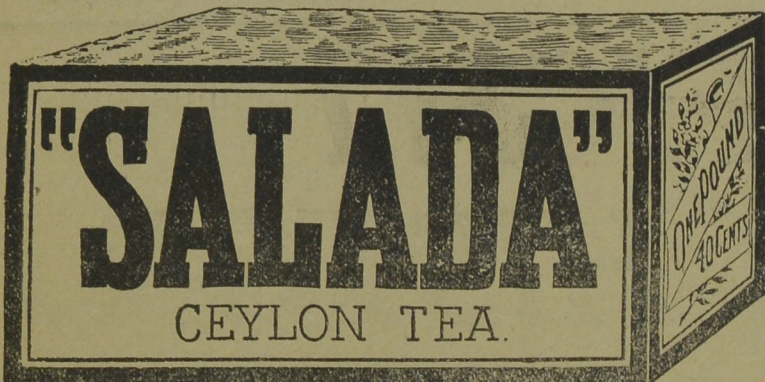

THE POTATO QUESTION AN ISSUE IN AROOSTOOK

Augusta, Me., Aug. 6.—The straw which indicates the direction of the political wind in the coming election will be first in the State of Maine. The earliest indication of the sentiment of the country towards the present Democratic administration at Washington will be received from the State on the fourteenth day of next month, on which date the regular election of State officers, representatives in Congress and legislative and county officials will be held. Scarcely less important than the test of the popularity of the Democratic administration will be the test of the virility and longevity of the Progressive party.

Governor William T. Haines, who was elected on the Republican ticket, at two years ago, is a candidate for re-election. His Democratic opponent is Oakley C. Curtis, the present mayor of Portland. The ticket of the Progressive party, the first they have had in this State, is headed by Harold Gardner as candidate for Governor.

In his campaign for re-election Governor Haines finds himself deeply involved in the agitation over the liquor traffic. Mr. Gardner, the Progressive candidate, has been pursuing him from stump to stump with charges of bad faith as to the Governor's claim that he is doing his best to enforce the prohibitory law. Governor Haines has claimed credit for the removal of these sheriffs who were nullifying the prohibitory law

by allowing it to be followed at will. Mr. Gardner denies credit to the Governor for the removal of these men by asserting that the method of removing them by the legislature was not the Governor's idea at all, and that if the method of removing which the Governor recommended of dealing with these men had been adopted, they would not have been removed.

Though the liquor question continues to permeate the campaign in every county and district, as it has done in the State of Maine for many years, there are national questions that are figuring to a considerable extent as issues in the contest. The Democratic tariff which has admitted potatoes to be brought into this country from Canada free of duty is not to the liking of the voters in Aroostook County, where more potatoes are raised than in any locality in the country. The Republican and Progressive speakers have endeavored to make the most of this issue, but the Democrats have come back with the reply that no matter how many barrels of potatoes may have come across the border, potatoes are, nevertheless, just as high as they ever were, and Maine farmers are getting just as much for them now as they ever received.

The question of free tolls for American ships in the Panama canal is also an issue in the present campaign. For years Maine has been a great ship-building State and she is much interested in the coastwise trade.

FERTILIZED EGGS

Chief Cause of Inferior Stock For Food Purposes

Eggs which have been fertilized constitute the greatest proportion of the inferior stock which, when examined, proves unfit for food. It is not necessary that these shall have remained for a time under a broody hen, a temperature of seventy degrees being, in itself, sufficient to cause the germ to commence to grow. If the heat is constant the development of the chick will continue, but if it ceases or is intermittent, putrefaction at once sets in and the egg becomes bad. On the other hand infertile eggs which are free from the active germ cell, under ordinary conditions, deteriorate seriously. Farmers and others selling eggs for market are recommended in a circular issued by the livestock branch of the Dominion Department of Agriculture, to kill off or dispose of the male birds after the breeding season. As a result of their remaining with the flock after the breeding season Canadian farmers lose each year at least a million dollars, through the presence of partially incubated eggs in the produce which is marketed. The fact that the best trade in many cities in Canada now offers the premium of from one to five cents per dozen, for non-fertilized eggs, suggests an additional financial consideration which but few can afford to overlook.

Motor Car Window Opener

The cumbersome method of raising or lowering the windows of motor cars and other carriages by means of a strap will soon be superseded by a German invention. By the new device the inmate of the carriage presses upwards or downwards a handle, and the window rises or falls accordingly. Moreover, the window can be raised or lowered to any required height, and will automatically stay where it is placed. This ingenious device has been brought before the notice of motor car body builders and its practical use demonstrated by means of a working model.

Two Goslings From One Egg

Two goslings were hatched from a single egg on one of the farms of Messrs. Chivers and Sons at Histon, Cambridge. Such an event is almost unprecedented, the birds from doubly-yolked eggs usually being deformed if they hatch out at all, which is rarely the case. These twins are well shaped and healthily developed, and there is every indication that they are going to grow into the vigorous birds. The egg that produced the twin birds was hatched out by a hen, who devoted to her foster children.

Dead Cats as Scarecrows

KING'S FAVORED TENANTS

Some Queer Rents Collected by King George

Some of the rents which are King George's due from certain of his loyal subjects are "more honored in the breach than in the observance." It would certainly surprise King George and Queen Mary if the Lord of the Manor of Addington, in Surrey should suddenly appear and plunk down on the Royal breakfast table the bowl of porridge which constitutes his yearly rent in acknowledgment of his Sovereign's overlordship.

Whether the present owner of the Foulis Estates in Scotland regularly pays his rent we cannot say, or whether the King, as is likely, shuts his eyes to the omission of the bucketful of snow which is his rightful due. As the estates are near Ben Nevis, there would certainly be no difficulty in obtaining a trainload of snow once a year, and probably even a bucketful in summer; but, as the King has little use for snow, probably the rent is never paid.

Quite a different and much more desirable rent is the one which has been charged to the tenant of Crenodon, in Buckinghamshire, from time immemorial. In September every year two faggots are paid at the Law Courts by the City Remembrancer as rent for lands held by the City Corporation from His Majesty the King. This official not only has to deliver the two faggots, but has to see that they are properly received and accept a duly signed and witnessed receipt for them, which is filed in the City's archives.

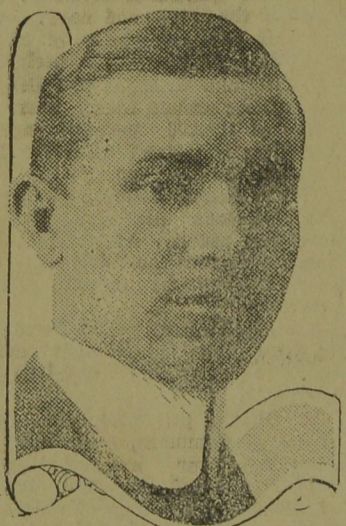
The authorities of the Isle of Portland make a queer sort of collection every November on behalf of His Majesty. It is called the "King's Halfpenny"; but, as a matter of fact every cottager on the island pays a farthing, every cottage with a garden a halfpenny, and every man with an acre of land or more three pence. This is called "quit rent."

When the King lately went across the Channel to pay his State visit to Paris, he ought to have been attended across the briny ocean by the present representative of Solomon Attfield, to whom King John gave his lands on condition that, whenever he or any of his successors crossed the Channel the said Solomon or his heirs should be in attendance to hold up the King's head when he was seasick.

If the King should visit Chichester, by ancient usage he ought immediately to demand a string for his crossbow; and if the King should be engaged in war and riding at the head of his troops, it would be incumbent upon the successors to the Corbet Estates, in Shropshire to provide him with a fitch of bacon every day!

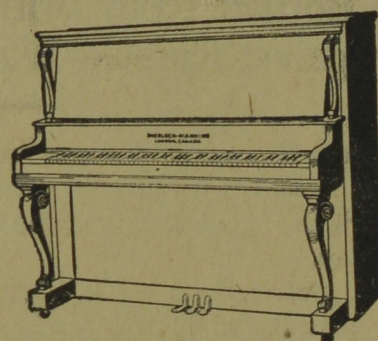

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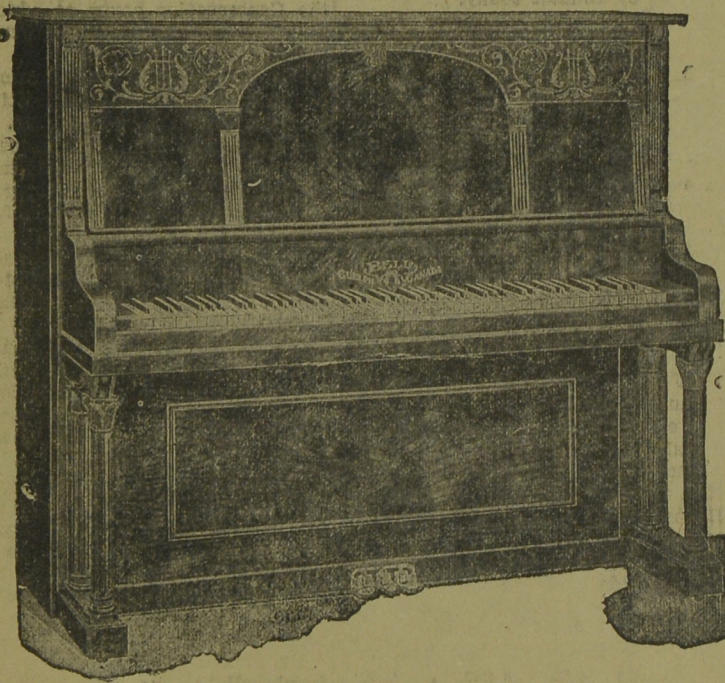
