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FREDERICTON AND C. P. R.

The Canadian Pacific Railway has announced that on and after February 9, there is to be but one train each way per day on the Gibson Branch. This is a retrograde step, which will place the people of the northwestern section of York county as far as transportation facilities are concerned, where they were several years ago. The Board of Trade has taken immediate action with regard to the matter and will have the support of all the people of Fredericton and the northwestern parishes in their attempts to have the cancelled trains continued. Fredericton gets much business from the country served by the Gibson Branch and the effect of the withdrawal of the two trains will be felt severely.

Fredericton deserves better treatment from the C.P.R. than is indicated by this cancellation. That rail way obtains a large traffic from this city and the country surrounding, a traffic large enough to entitle the people to some consideration in regard to service on the Gibson Branch.

FARMERS ARE INDIGNANT

Amongst the resolutions considered by the Grain Growers' Convention at Brandon, Man., was this: "That this convention views with alarm the increasing corruption in elections, both Federal and Provincial, and hereby express their indignation and condemnation of such practices, and demand that the law bearing upon elections be so changed that the parties proved guilty can be adequately punished."

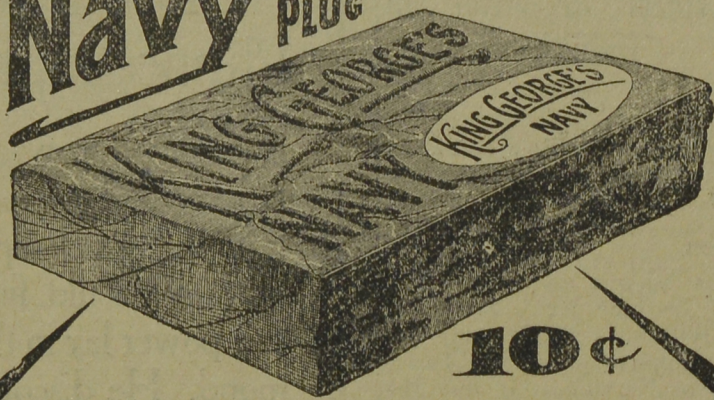

Premier Borden has been perfectly content to profit by any electoral corruption that will win ridings for his party, and instead of appointing a public prosecutor, has countenanced the engager, has countenanced the engaging of counsel to defend the election crooks who worked for his party.

The revolt among the Western Conservative members at Ottawa shows that the movement for lower tariff and freer markets has reached such magnitude that party bounds have been broken and the Borden government finds itself in the position in which it must offend its high tariff supporters or its low tariff followers. It can be safely prophesied that the manufacturers who contributed the "resources of civilization" which defeated the Laurier administration upon the issue of reciprocity will see to it that the tariff will not be lowered sufficiently to do any good to the farmer and consumer. The Tory party is beginning to find out whether or not reciprocity and the economic principles it represented are dead.

The scheme of recruiting the British army by newspaper advertisement recently inaugurated by the War Office, is excellent testimony to the value of newspaper publicity. About ten days ago the war office inserted in most newspapers alluring announcements detailing the advantages resulting from enlistment in the army, and inviting would-be recruits to write for booklets with further information given. Fifty thousand copies of this booklet were prepared, and have all been applied for, thus showing that newspaper advertisements reached the quarters desired.

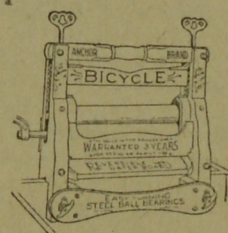

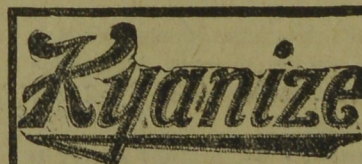

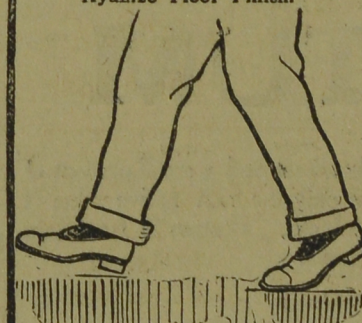
