

URGES STRICT NEU-TRALITY FOR THE U. S.

The New York Herald in a short editorial adjures the United States to remain neutral during the Europ ean struggle, not only in words, but also deeds, adding:

"Three thousand miles of sea separating this continent from scenes of conflict and of carnage furnish a dod-given isolation that permits the United States to observe neutrality. It must be not only a neutrality cor rect in theory but it must carefully avoid everything that could possibly gave rise to suspicion in any quarter of incorrectness. It is vitally neces sary that the United States play no favorites in dealing with the nations at war. The greatest care must be exercised by persons holding official positions, high and low, to avoid action that, however well meant, might lead this country into serious complications.

"This is a time of world excitement. The passions of nations are as inflammable as those of the individuals who make up their population. It is a time too, of wild talk. Nothing, for instance, could be more foolish (than the suggestion emanat ing from some wireacre at Washington that wheat and other foodstuffs be as neutral as their government is and as it must remain."
