AMENDMENT TO HOME
RULE BILL IS DEFEATED

London, April 6.—By a majority of
eighty an amendment for the rejection
of the home rule bill was de-
feated in the House of Commons to-
night, and without division the bill
was given for the third time its second
reading in the house.

The announcement of the figures
evoked louder cheers from the op-
position than from the ministerialists
the opposition interpreting them as
gratifying proof of a dwindling govern-
ment majority. But the diminution
is accounted for, to some extent,
by the abstention from voting of the
O'Brienites.

The speeches today were generally
much more conciliatory in tone than
those which marked the bill's earlier
passages, John E. Redmond, the Na-
tionalist leader, who opened the de-
bate again held out the olive branch
to Ulster in a speech of great elo-
quence, but insisted that it was im-
possible for him and his colleagues
to agree to the permanent exclusion
of Ulster and to abandon the prin-
ciple "Ireland a nation."

NEW DREADNOUGHT
ADDED TO U. S. NAVY

New York, April 6.—The huge battle
ship New York, the most terrible en-
gine of destruction ever built in the
United States navy yard, was formal-
ly placed in commission today. The
event was attended with simple but
impressive ceremonies. A large crowd
visited the New York navy yard to
witness the exercises. A mighty cheer
burst from the throats of the specta-
tors as the Stars and Stripes were
raised to the masthead of the new
dreadnought. The officers and crew
were mustered on deck while the com-
mander read the orders placing the
vessel in commission. The ship's
band played the Star Spangled Banner
and the ceremonies were concluded
with the customary salute.

Within a cable's length of the New
York lay her sister ship, the great
battleship Texas which recently ar-
rived at the navy yard from the yard
of her builders at Newport News to
receive the final touches necessary for
her absolute completion.

Not only in size but in the calibre of
the guns comprising their main bat-
teries are the New York and Texas
the most formidable battleships ever
built. Up to the present time the 13-
inch gun, which has not been used on
any of the newer ships of the navy,
has been the limit in calibre of naval
guns. The New York and Texas, how-
ever, will each carry ten 14-inch guns
mounted two to a turret, and so ar-
ranged that all of them can be fired
in a broadside, or forward, or aft, at
the same time.

The arrangement of three turrets
aft and two forward of the bridge is
the work of the Naval Construction
Corps of the United States navy.
Great Britain has followed this de-
sign in her newest dreadnoughts and
this is considered one of the highest
compliments ever paid American de-
signers and constructors.

ENQUIRY ABOUT THE
VALLEY RAILWAY

HAS NO INFORMATION
Hon. Mr. Flemming, in answer to
Mr. Dugal's inquiry said:—

Q 1—Has a report been made by
the Inspecting Engineer of the Val-
ley Railway or by any one else, to
the Government or has the Govern-
ment the information showing

(a) What amount per mile did sub-
contractors upon each section of the
Valley Railway agree to construct
the road ready for the laying of
the sleepers.

(b) What sleepers would cost per
mile what the rails would cost per
mile, and what the placing of each
would cost per mile?

(c) What is the estimated cost of
the necessary railway stations upon
each of the actions under construc-
tion?

(d) What is the estimated cost of
the switches and sidings and fencing
respectively?

(e) What is the estimated cost of
the yards and shops respectively up-
on those sections?

(f) What would be the cost of
any other items not included in the
above queries necessary for the com-
pletion of the railway?

(g) What is the estimated cost per
mile of completing that portion of
the Valley Railway, already under
construction, ready for operation?

A.—No, none of the information
asked for is required of the Railway
Company.

ACCEPTS ATTACK ON N.T.R.
AS AN HONOR

"In a lengthy course of the debate
I have had the privilege of having
been taken to task more than once,
many, many times, and held respon-
sible for the construction of this
railway. The statements, charges,
reproaches, stigmas, call them what
you will, I accept, yea accept as an
honor. (Cheers.) I hold myself
largely responsible for conceiving and
carrying on this great undertaking,
an undertaking conceived to secure
for this dominion a transcontinental
railway, all on Canadian soil, the best
and shortest on the American con-
tinent. (Renewed cheers.)

"I had high aspirations. I sought
to bring the western farmer closer
to the markets of the world, I sought
to do my share to open up the great
fertile plains of Northern Ontario and
Quebec. I planned to link the pro-
ducing lands with the great Atlantic
and Pacific ports, I aimed to be in
the van of those who courted the
new and great possibilities of the
dawning, Oriental trade. Yes, all
these considerations impelled us to
construct the best railway 'that
science could devise, or money could
build.' (Cheers, laughter and re-
newed cheering.) Ah, yes, I repeat,
'that science could devise or money
could build.' And I use the words in
a far nobler purpose than they were
ever used before. (Renewed cheering)
'We fell before our task was com-
pleted. To other hands was com-
mitted the completion of the work.
We have our responsibilities on this
side; yonder they have their respon-
sibility on the other side. We have
the responsibility of building; we
accept it gladly. They have the re-
sponsibility of destroying; they can-
not escape it.'—Sir Wilfrid Laurier
