rigidly followed. It seemed somewhat incongruous that any province should have a smaller representation in the House of Commons than in the Senate. Moreover, Prince Edward Island was a rural province, and it had been the practise to fix a rather higher unit for urban communities than for rural communities. If the rural population of Prince Edward Island, a little less than one hundred thousand, were placed in any other province it would have at least four members in the Commons.

THE ALLOTMENT TO PROVINCES

The allotment of membership to the various provinces will be as follows: Ontario, eighty-two, a reduction of four; Quebec sixty-two, unchanged; Nova Scotia sixteen, a reduction of two; New Brunswick eleven, a reduction of two; Prince Edward Island, left blank; Manitoba fifteen, an increase of five; Saskatchewan sixteen, an increase of six; Alberta twelve, an increase of five; British Columbia thirteen, an increase of six; Yukon, one, unchanged.

Premier Borden announced his decision to follow the practise established by Sir Wilfrid Laurier when in office and appoint a committee of seven members of the House, four representing the government and three the opposition, to confer and report on the allotment of the constituencies in the various provinces, "a plan which, on the whole, did the work fairly well," Mr. Borden commented.

An effort should be made, he submitted, to endeavor to work out certain principles to guide the committee in its work. The Liberals, he said, had been largely guided by municipal boundaries, but he thought equality of population should enter equally into its consideration and the matter of community of interest.

WILL FOLLOW LAURIER'S POLICY

He recognized the soundness of the position taken by Sir Wilfrid Laurier that a greater unity of population should be required for urban than for rural communities. At the same time Sir Wilfrid had maintained that the guiding principle should be to equalize the population in the various ridings, and this dictum he accepted in its entirety.

CHARGES AGAINST OFFICIALS.

On going into supply, Dr. Neely of Humboldt, rose to make the charge to which he had yesterday referred in the House. The number of homestead entries in Canada, he said, had decreased, but that of homestead officials increased, and the purpose of this seemed to be to swell the list of Conservative canvassers. One Arthur Smythe of Humboldt, a homestead inspector, had taken part in elections in Saskatchewan and been fined in the courts therefor. Mr. Neely also charged that W. L. Campbell, a former member of the House, and now superintendent of Indian agencies, had been present in Qu'Appelle, Sask., for election purposes; had been advertised to speak at a campaign meeting and that he had treated a Qu'Appelle half-breed till the latter had become drunk; had laid out all night on the prairie and had his feet frozen. He also charged certain irregularities with regard to Mr. Campbell's expenses lists.

BONSPIEL OPENS IN WINNIPEG, MAN.

Winnipeg, Man., Feb. 11—Bedecked in shanter and mits a small army of curling enthusiasts turned out today for the opening of the annual bonspiel given here under the auspices of the Manitoba Curling Association. A large entry list promises one of the most successful events of recent years. The tournament is open to all rinks affiliated with regularly organized curling associations, either in Canada or the United States.
