WILSON'S ACHIEVEMENT

Particulars as to Wilson's fine feat have been ascertained from a reliable source, says The Week,y Scotsman of December 7th. It took place in the severe fighting near the village of Verneuil on September 14, the day on which Lieutenant Sir Archibald Gibon-Craig of the same regiment, was Still through the cloven skies they killed. They went out alone and managed to get quite close to the enemy's position, when Wil-son's companion was killed. Undaunt ed, however, Wilson continued on his perflous mission. One by one he shot the officer and the entragum team of six soldiers, and they ran in and took possession of the gun and two cases and a half of ammunition.


