



## Inside the Kettle and Out

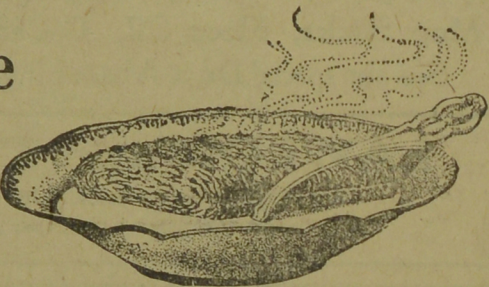
LOWYR HAINESVILLE

## BOTHA DRIVES BEYERS COMMANDO IN ROUT

London, Oct. 29—The following official statement was issued last night regarding the rebellion in the Union of South Africa:

"General Botha reports that he left Rustenburg, a district in the western part of the Transvaal colony, on Tuesday morning and proceeded in the direction in which General Christian Beyers, with his commando, was supposed to be. He came in touch with General Beyers' men in the forenoon and

subject to the British crown. If, on the other hand, Germany should by any chance, realize her vision of world power, it is equally certain that South Africa will be subject to the Kaiser. The power that has trodden on Belgium, whose representatives express daily whole-souled contempt for scraps of paper, will assuredly disregard any promises that may have been made in bidding for the help of the disaffected. The latter, in the event of German success, would have cause to regret, under the most illiberal rule the world knows, their ingratitude for the generous and consistent magnanimity with which they have been treated by British statesmen."

The Daily News says:

"General De Wet was a chivalrous, as well as a brave enemy, and if he can forego the signature which he attached to the peace treaty, many lesser men who may have hesitated will swing over to treason. It would be ridiculous to depreciate a movement which much fanaticism has gone to make, but seldom have men with no qualities provoked so needless and fertile a tragedy as that of which De Wet and Beyers have made themselves responsible."

"If there are any Boers who believe that if Germany has its way it will give them a vestige of independence they must be consummate fools."

The Daily Telegraph says:

"The worst feature in such treachery as that of Beyers and De Wet is that it appeals to all of the most ignorant and prejudiced members of the community, and flatters the deep-living hopes and aspirations of discontented retrograde minds."
