TRUSTEES TO ERECT NEW SCHOOL BUILDING ON SMYTHE STREET

Committee Appointed at Meeting of the Board to Take the Matter in Hand—An Amendment by Mr. Sharkey Was Voted Down

A special meeting of the School Board was held yesterday afternoon to further consider the question of the erection of a new school building and to provide ways and means in connection therewith. The question of the petition of the teachers for increase of salary was also under consideration.

The chairman, Dr. VanWart, presided and the other members in attendance were Mrs. Clark, Mrs. Lynch, Mr. Sterling, Mr. Weddall, Mr. Spurden, Dr. Crocket, Mr. Lemont and the secretary.

MOTION AND AMENDMENT.

The two main questions of the session were the proposed new building and the petition for increase of salary and upon the former question each member, led off by Mr. Sharkey, expressed his opinion and this important public question assumed concrete form when Mr. Sterling moved the following resolution:—"This Board having carefully considered the urgent requirements at present existing for the relief of the congestion in Grades I to VIII, hereby decide to take the necessary steps (Continued on page five)

MAYOR HOOPER SAYS FOSTER HAS NOT BEEN APPROACHED

Report in St. John Standard Today Not Correct, Says Chairman of Police Commission--Does Not Know A. R. Foster

Mayor Hooper, chairman of the Police Commission, today made the statement to The Mail that no offer had been made to Albion R. Foster of Hartland, a member of the C.P.R. police, to take the position of Chief of Police of Fredericton, and said that there was no foundation for the following despatch, which appeared in today's St. John Standard, dated Hartland:

"A. R. Foster, C.P.R. police officer for this division, has had, what was thought by those tendering it, a very tempting offer from the City of Fredericton to take the position of chief of police of that city. The bait was not sufficiently alluring, however, and Mr. Foster will remain in the employ of the railway company, who are well satisfied with his services."

DOES NOT KNOW HIM.

"The Police Commission has had no communication with Mr. Foster. Personally, I don't even know him," said His Worship. "There is absolutely nothing of truth in that item."

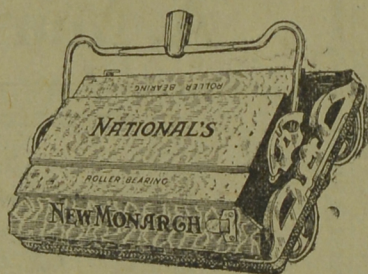
