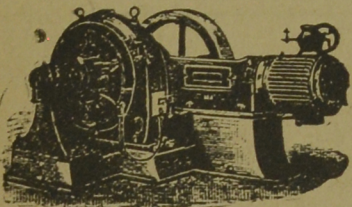

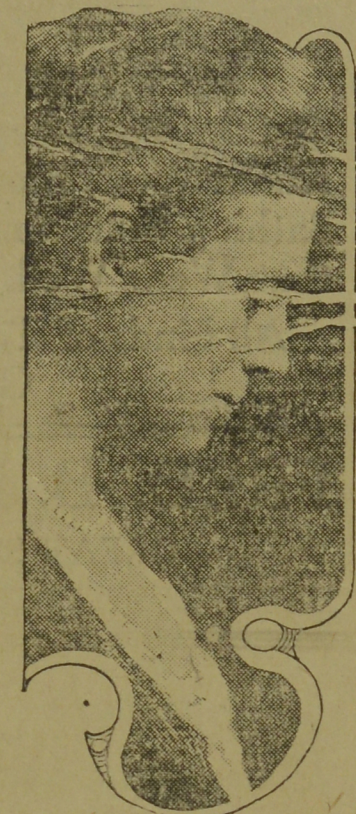
## HONEY STATISTICS

Living Conditions Favorable For Busy Workers and Food Plentiful

For the purposes of reporting on the condition of bees in Ontario and the honey crop prospects blanks are sent to a large number of beekeepers by the Department of Agriculture. One thousand replies are received, on an average, from which reports are summarized.

The total number of colonies reported according to last figures is about 41,318, being an average of 32 colonies, spring count, for each beekeeper reporting. The winter loss is about 7½ per cent. What losses there are during the winter are due principally to starvation caused by lack of sufficient feed in the hives.

So far as the condition of bees is concerned, the prospects for a good honey crop this year are very good, but clover is only in a fair condition, having been very much injured in many localities by unfavorable weather conditions.

"Any woman on a farm," says Mrs. Foulke, "be it wife, mother, sister or housekeeper, ought to know all the business that is going on around the farm. Too often I find they do not know. My idea is that every woman ought to know how to run her husband's farm. Then, if he dies, and he is left with children, she can bring them up. As it is, generally, he has to sell out and go to some city, where nearly everybody in the family almost starves."

## CURIOUS FISH

Some Finny Creatures Croak; Some Hum and One Shrieks

Fishes have often been referred to as "voiceless, emotionless creatures," but scientific investigation has demonstrated that like land animals they are largely swayed by the same emotions, and that in a limited way, they give expression thereto. There are more than 300 species of fish which are known to produce sound. One particular kind of fish, which are called "maigres," emit sound having a duration of about twenty five seconds, and also various notes usually degenerating into a mere humming, either from excess or want of intensity. When these fish are travelling in shoals the sounds give out by them may be heard from a depth of twenty fathoms. More than once it has been suggested that the story of the sirens had its origin in the utterances of these fish.

When captured, the scad, or horse mackerel, the globe fish, the grunt, the pig-fish, and the hog-fish all emit sounds resembling the grunt of a pig while one, well known along the Atlantic coast as the croaker, derives its name from the croak it gives when taken into a boat. The barbel and the carp also croak when taken from the water.

There is a species of "sea-frog" found by the natives of Malabar, an so-called on account of the noise it makes when captured. The red gurnard has been dubbed the "sea-croak" by reason of its croaking. The mado, a fish found in the Rio Paran, is most remarkable for the harsh grating sound it emits when caught with hook and line. It is said that this noise can be heard distinctly while the fish is yet beneath the surface.

There is a fish in the Tagus, the emits sounds resembling the vibrations of a deep-toned bell, going on pedal pipe of an organ. Herring, when the net has been drawn round them, have been observed to do the same, and similar accounts are given of the river bullhead. An amphibious silurid fish, on being taken into the hand, is said to shriek, and certain of the blennies emit similar sounds. In the Gulf of Mexico the b'e jewfish breaks the stillness of the night on the waters with his sonorous "boom-boom!"

The Cape Breton of today is a land of summer loveliness, a vast island where in are other ailes innumerable. Its shores are washed by the billows of the Atlantic, and by the Gulf of St. Lawrence. The shining waters of the Bras d'Or Lakes divide it in twain, and provide a spacious water way through the interior. There are too, numerous rivers, streams and fresh water lakes. 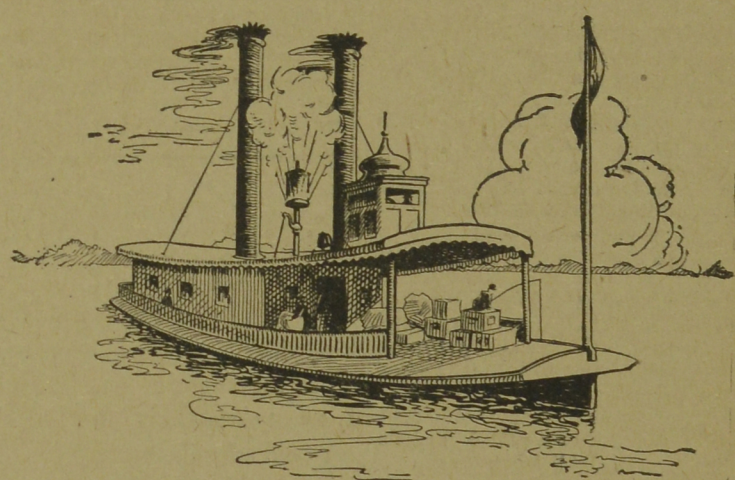
## THE ATLANTA BATTLE ANNIVERSARY
