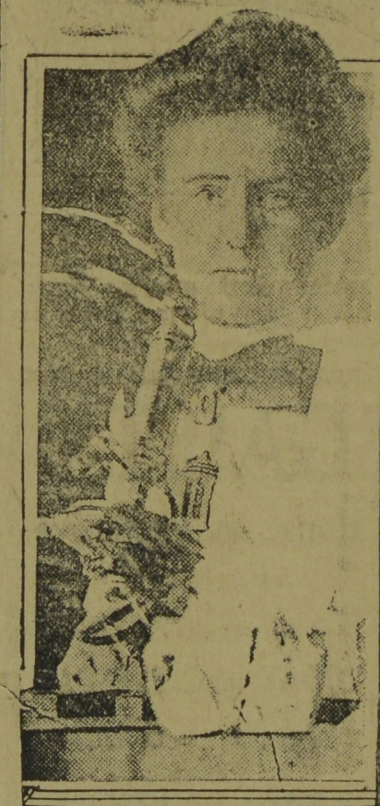
He misses somethin' that he has
