MORE TROOPS TO

GO FROM CANADA

Ottawa, Oct. 18-An official statement g,ven out tonight by the prime ninister, Sir Robert Borden, announ ces that the government will proceed at once with the organization of Can-ada's second expeditionary force, the first installment of which, consisting of 10,000 men, is to be dispatched December.

Sixteen to twenty thousand men are to be immediately enlisted under the supervision of the commanding officers of the various military diviions throughout Canada, and as vailable the government will keep continuously under arms, and in training a total force of 40,000 men, including some 10,000 needed for garson and outpost duty in Canada.

The prime minister states that this will be maintained as long as he war lasts or as long as the war ffica wants them, and a continuous tream of reinforcements will thus be available for service at the front.


