TAX REFORM ADVOCATED

PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX.

"As to the personal property tax this is a tax that not since man organized into society and collected public revenue, has it ever been possible to collect with any degree of equity, even when we had the privilege of using the rack and thumb screws and one thing is certain with only the terror of a violated oath staring a modern highly developed Christian in the face we meet with no more success than our foolish forefathers. But even if we could collect it, what would be the effect? The merchant upon whose stock of goods we levy the tax would but add that tax to the cost of the goods and it would be paid, not by the wealthy merchant but by the buyer of the merchant's goods and the buyers of the merchant's goods as a whole are poor, for the mass of the people are poor. So we fail utterly to get at the wealthy by taxing wealth, we simply bind heavy burdens, grievous to be borne on backs already over-

loaded.

EFFECT OF LAND TAX.

"This principle applies to any tax levied upon anything that is a product of labor. If you tax houses you make houses scarce and dearer to the users. If you tax clothing you make clothes scarcer and dearer to the user. But if you tax land-values you make land cheaper and more accessible for the reason that you force into use large areas that are now held for speculation, thereby creating a competition among land-owners for land users and of course, the tendency of this is to make land cheaper for labor and for capital.

"Now for long years we have been working under the notion that a man ought to pay taxes according to what he has. That is not sound nor is it honest, nor is it good business. A man ought to pay taxes according to what he gets from society not according to what he has done for himself, for there may be no relationship between the result of a man's personal industry and thrift and

LETTER FROM STANLEY BOARD OF TRADE

Stanley, N. B.

To the Editor of the Standard:
Sir,—In its issue of April 3rd, a St. John paper publishes an extract from a letter written by Mayoe Frink of St. John, N.B., re "through freight," and comments upon the same in its editorial columns.

Both Mayor Frink and the writer of the editorial seemed to have overlooked the fact that it is quite possible to connect the valley road at Fredericton with the Grand Trunk Pacific at Napadogan without either building a road between those points or using the heavy grades on the Canada Eastern. They point out that the Canada Eastern runs up the valley of the Nashwaak to Cross Creek and then follows up the latter stream towards McGivay Junction up very heavy grades, but they have forgotten to mention the fact that the York and Carleton continues on from Cross Creek up the valley of the Nashwaak to Stanley and thence on to Ryan Brook, ten miles from Cross Creek Junction. From Ryan Brook, following the valley of the Nashwaak to its head waters, the distance is only nine miles to Napadogan and this would seem to be the natural, and at the present time, the only practical way of diverting the G.T.P. freight. Only nine miles of new road need to be built. The whole connecting link would be but nineteen miles long, and from the formation of the country it should be possible to build this link up to the G.T.P. standards at a comparatively low cost. In the part of the road already built, that is the ten miles from Cross Creek to Ryan Brook, the elevation is only one hundred and forty feet, and by some regrading, pusher grades on the whole link could be eliminated. This link would place Napadogan with all its facilities for handling freight, within one hundred and twenty miles of St. John, N.B., or about the same distance as between Napadogan and Moncton. If the McGivay Junction route were used not only would heavy grades be encountered, but a great amount of money would have to be spent at the Junction before suitable connections could be made, and the vast amount of money spent at Napadogan would practically have been wasted.

what society does for him. The true measure of what society does for an individual citizen is the value of the land that he desires exclusive possession of, for land value is the reflection of the presence of population and added to that it represents the advantages of social activities. "The value of the land of a town where there are poorly paved streets, poor lighting and poor water supply, etc., will be very much lower than in a town whose streets are well paved, sewered, lighted, policed, etc. In other words, all of the social activities of the town are capitalized and reflected in the value of the land. The man on the front street enjoying all of these advantages gets more from society than the man on the back street where social conveniences are not so highly developed. He gets less from society than the other citizen and therefore should pay less—

COST OF LIVING.

"We have been in the habit for many years of taxing land values very lightly and labor values very heavily. Doing this we have increased the cost of living through the taxes on labor values and through our failure to assess land values as we should, we have given a greater incentive to the land speculators to hold land out of use thereby making land artificially scarcer and dearer, consequently raising rent and increasing the cost of living. We have been giving to private individuals public property and on the other hand, we have been taking from private individuals private property for public use.

EFFECT IN FREDERICTON.

"We should adopt a system of taxation that would encourage production and induce capital to come into the town, without increasing the cost of living to the citizens and at the same time offer the least inducement to land speculation. In Fredericton there is a population of about eight thousand. A superficial area of fifteen thousand and sixty acres. This, of course, is a tremendous superficial area for such a small population.

ONE LITTLE EARWIG STOPPED A RAILWAY

London, March 28—Little things achieve great objects; but even the story of Bruce and the Spider and that of the Lion and the Mouse pale into insignificance beside an incident on the District Railway, when an earwig held up for ten minutes all the traffic from Hounslow Barracks—about six hundred tons.

The signal was seen to be at danger when the 12.1 train from Hounslow arrived at Heston Hounslow, and other trains following were similarly delayed.

It was afterwards found that an earwig had found its way into the signalling apparatus between the electric magnet and the contact. This caused the signals to be set at danger.

All signals in the ordinary course stand at clear. They are held off in this position by electric magnets, and are so weighted that at the slightest interference they fall automatically and show danger.

The earwig's adventure had caused the contact to be destroyed, and the signal went to danger by its own balance.

To get some idea of the insect's exploit one must take into consideration the relative weight of one earwig and compare it with about six hundred tons of traffic—which was the total weight that this particular specimen of the tribe had the audacity to hold up.

Roughly, there are about 400 earwigs to the ounce, or 6,400 to the pound. We thus get the progression: Earwig 1lb. cwt. ton
1 equals 6,400 x 122 x 20 x 600

If anyone works this out he will find that the District Railway earwig stopped a force 8,601,600,000 times its own weight.

No troops were being moved from Hounslow at the time, so that no sinister design can be read into the earwig's action.

However, I am dealing with the town as I find it. This would give you in lots 66x160, feet, 61,440. An average assessment of two dollars per lot per year would yield \$122,880 per year. Your budget of about \$100,000 is now raised with great difficulty by a poll tax, income tax, business tax, improvement tax, all of these taxes which are oppressive and restrictive in their nature could be abolished and without taking private property for public use, without taking from any man that to which he is morally entitled, without decreasing the cost of living, without penalizing production or restricting trade, you would raise \$22,880 more than you get now."
