FLORENCE FAIRBANKS ON FADS AND FASHIONS

The separate coat contrasting in color as well as in material has made such hit this summer that, in all probability, it will be reckoned among the autumn modes too. Its most faddish expression has been the coat of white or light color associated with a lightly draped black satin skirt, but there plenty of variations upon the mode and it will be easy to work out others in winter materials.

The loose half-length coat which has obtained favor this summer is another mode which is fairly sure of autumn acceptance and indeed new models of this class are coming in now in materials heavier than those of the summer. For some purposes the full length coat is the practical and comfortable thing, but for walking a shorter coat is certainly more comfortable, and the loose, ample, rough half-length sporting coats of this season are very good looking. Many of these are loosely belted in the back. Others are quite straight. Half-length beach coats in very rough but soft and light white wools are in high favor at the Continental resorts and are also appearing here.

Daintily striped silks are made up without frills, the only relief other than the daintily handling of the stripe consisting of some bits of fine embroidered muslin about the bodice in the shape of collar and cuffs. These striped silks are particularly fresh and pretty in taffeta, but are also shown in rapiers and other supple, lightweight silks. In taffeta, too, there are wider stripes in white and color, but the pin stripes have a more youthful air and there are pretty pin checks, too, though these do not make so well as the stripes. Striped gauze, chiffon, mousseline,

etc., are successfully made up over white in simple fashion with girde of color and are youthful and delectable for afternoon or informal evening wear. Eponge of the cotton and linen varieties is another material which has won considerable favor and suits of all white eponge are worn by many young girls as substitutes for linen. The material looks fresh even longer than the loose woven, crases and the soft temie linens.

Some fascinating afternoon frocks in charmeuse are arranged with fairly full skirts, adorned with a trimming composed of two deep flounces of cream colored Machlin lace. The bodices are draped with flou folds of the same fine dentelle and to complete the costumes, charming little coats in shot effect taffeta are provided, trimmed with lace at the neck and wrists, and lined with soft satin.

A novelty of the present season is the mingling of white or cream colored lace with black. Sometimes there is a short black lace jacket combined with a white lace gown, and artistic arrangement allows the white lace to be seen at the sides, thus diminishing the too sharp contrast of color. The introduction of cerise with lace is frequent, the rage for cherry color being still very great.

The white season is affecting even negligees. Far more than usual of these airy garments are seen, made of India silk and lawn, fine linen, allover embroidery and lace. The most open of such negligees require a slip underneath.

Undergarments, such as combinations, skirts and night gowns, are being made of china silk or crepe de chene, white or delicately tinted.

CHEAP FARES TO TORONTO EXHIBITION

In connection with the Canadian Exhibition at Toronto which will be held this year from August 24th until September 9th, the Intercolonial Railway will give very low excursion rates which will give the opportunity to many to visit the "Queen City" on the occasion of its great annual fete.

The Toronto Fair is the largest and most attractive of annual exhibitions in America, and this year new permanent buildings have been constructed and its extensive boundaries enlarged by new boulevards.
