THE NAVY QUESTION

With recent internal difficulties in the United Kingdom there has come another evidence of the folly of the policy of contribution and centrallization in naval affairs as proposed by the Borden government and of the soundness of the position taken by the Liberals in the Canadian parliament in insisting that ships provided by the dominion shall be subject, in time of peace, to the control of the Canadian people.

In the past few months bitter difficulties and differences have arisen in the United Kingdom in regard to the question of home rule for Ireland. The possibility of disturbance and conflict in Ulster led the British government to take steps to meet the serious situation which threaten-Certain orders were issued to the army and to a squadron of the navy. With the propriety and wisdom of those orders the dominion is not concerned but every Canadian knows the angry outbursts which the government's action brought from many opponents of home rule in the bursts which resulted on the part of friends of the administration.
