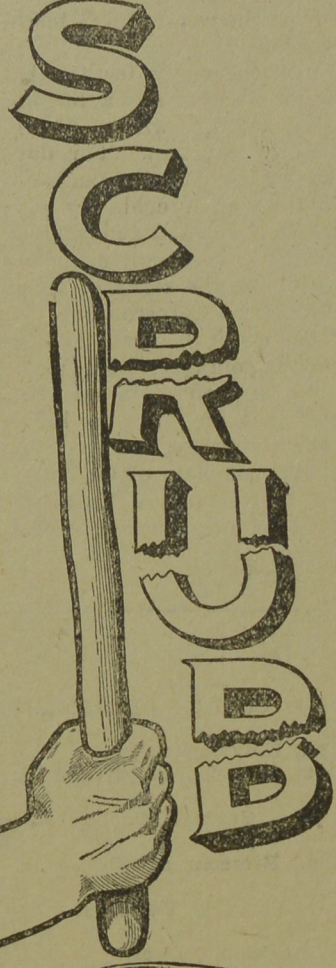

#### Sawdust Bread

There is a bakery in Germany that turns out 20,000 loaves of sawdust bread daily and finds a ready market for this output. Although this "wooden bread" is intended for consumption for horses only, it is claimed by the manufacturer that in case of famine it would furnish a nutritious and highly satisfactory food for human beings. The sawdust is first subjected to a process of fermentation and various chemical manipulation, and is mixed with one-third part of rye flour. It is then formed into loaves and baked in an oven like any other bread.

## A FEW FACTS FOR THE ELECTORS OF YORK CO.

To the Editor of The Mail:

A few Sabbaths ago when it was stormy, one who was present at the church intimated that the storm did not prevent persons coming to the hotel for drink. In several places in this city there were groups of drinking men on that holy day. The next day, when calling on a friend, I was informed that her husband had several men employed, all of whom drank and that on the previous Saturday two of their wives called for their husband's wages but one of them only received one dollar and a quarter and the other one dollar, the balance of the wages having been spent in drink. There were in these homes seven children. One of these wives cried and said, "We are cold and hungry."

There are hundreds of families in town suffering from the illicit sale of liquor. Drunkenness is rampant. In the bible thousands of years ago, this sin was linked with whoredom. Ever since they have been like the Siamese twins. They prevail to such an extent in this city that men commit them unblushingly, and become candidates for the highest offices of the city or county can confer. The fearful consequences of these abominations are not confined to those who commit them. They do not perish alone in their iniquity. The sin of fathers is yet visited on their innocent children.

It may be asked is not this a Scott Act town? Why is not the Scott Act enforced. This is the answer, The present city council thought it wise to give the control of the police to a commission of three who would be independent of politics and could dismiss any one suspected of taking a bribe from the rum-sellers. This made an act of the provincial legislature necessary. Mr. McLeod, the city member, undertook this at the request of the council. The act was passed.

When a member of this county was asked why Dr. Foster, whom a deputation of Mr. McLeod's supporters wished him to appoint, was not on the commission, the reply was that he is too extreme a man and that he would

not be acceptable to the liquor party. That commission has not made the police do their duty in so far as the enforcing of the Scott Act is concerned. Those who understand the situation tell us that in a very short time this would become a dry town, if those who have sworn to enforce our laws would make an honest effort to do so.

We have been too careless in the election of our legislators. The party men, no matter what his position or calling, will support his candidate, no matter how his character may be smirched. I am told that many of our members drink and that the governor has intoxicating liquor at his social functions, although he belongs to a church that forbids its members buying or selling intoxicating drinks or using them unless in extreme necessity. Judging from Mr. Guthrie's record, his election would not improve matters. When our city council was seeking legislation in the interest of the Scott Act enforcement, Mr. Guthrie went before the legislature and opposed it. He was chairman of the police commission for two years and the records prove that he made no effort to enforce the Scott Act. Let the electors of York rise in their might and set all the counties in New Brunswick an example.

## To the Electors Of the County of York

GENTLEMEN:

At the request of a large number of electors, I, James M. Scott, offer myself as a candidate for the vacant seat in the Legislative Assembly for the County of York. I present myself as an Independent Liberal Conservative, strongly opposed to the methods of the machine, which has sought to control both Federal and Provincial affairs in this constituency over the heads of the representatives of the county, and without reference to the wishes of the people.

The recent, so-called convention, for the selection of a candidate, was irregularly called for a certain date by the secretary without the authority of the president and against his protest—an example of usurpation of authority and of deception such as the party here has never known. To bring a large number of electors together under such circumstances is a piece of deception which, I am sure, this constituency will not tolerate and will vigorously resent.

The treatment accorded the County in the recent reconstruction of the government is such as to call forth our strongest protest. A portfolio was vacated in York—the county which was largely responsible for placing the present administration in power—it is not restored to us; we are not even given a voice in the government. A portfolio was vacated in Charlotte; it is immediately filled by a representative of that constituency. Shall we calmly suffer such a rebuff and lie down under such a humiliation? Who are the men who are responsible for this? They are the men who, through the exercise of patronage, control the machine and who boast that they have kept York from being represented in the government. They are the men who for personal reasons, seek to foist upon us by an irregularly called convention, by an impossible method of voting and by an abuse of patronage, without regard to consequences a candidate who was opposed by two of the elected representatives of the county and who is known to be unacceptable to leading men of the party and to a large and important body of the electorate.

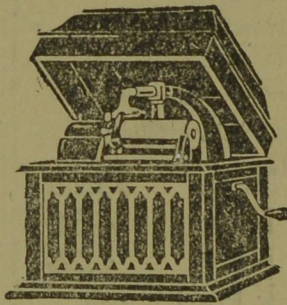

In the meantime, I feel assured that the better judgment of the county will reverse an act which dishonors our record and stains our name, and the metropolitan constituency of York be freed from the influence which seeks to enslave us. I am much mistaken if there is not a spirit of independence in this county which will not submit to be oppressed and a fund of good sense among us which will not be deceived.

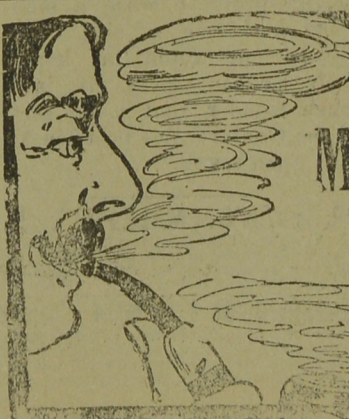

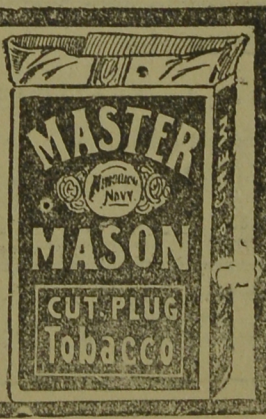
