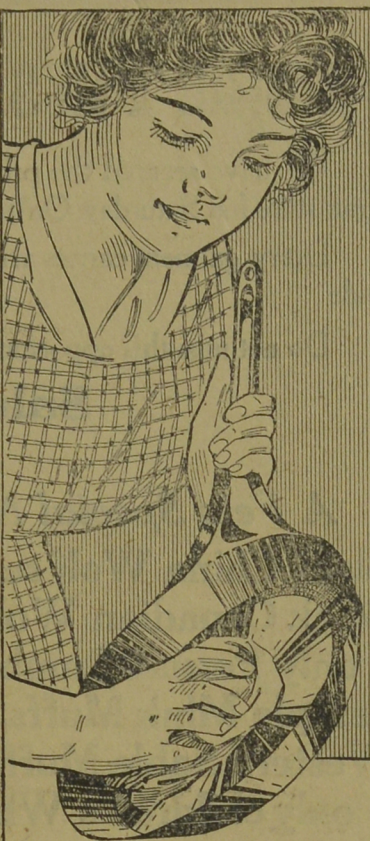

FRICK FAMILY MOVE INTO NEW MANSION

New York, Nov. 16 — Henry C. Frick's \$2,000,000 home in Fifth ave. between Seventieth and Seventy-first sts., is ready for his occupancy. Today he began to move, thereby bringing to a close his nine years' occupancy of the William H. Vanderbilt house at 640 Fifth Ave.

Construction of the Frick house has been under way for two years. It occupies the site of the old Lenox Library, for which Mr. Frick paid \$214,000 in 1903, and which has a depth of one hundred and seventy-five feet, with a Fifth Ave. frontage of 200 feet.

At Seventy-first st., Mr. Frick's office and his art gallery carry the structure to the Fifth ave. line; the rest of it stands back a distance of 75 feet this "front yard" being given over to a sunken pool and an Italian garden.

The art gallery, which will embrace 3500 square feet, is the distinctive feature of the house. It will contain the pictures that the steel man has been gathering for the last twenty-five years, and whose total purchase price he alone knows. It is probable however, that the collection cost him more than \$10,000,000.

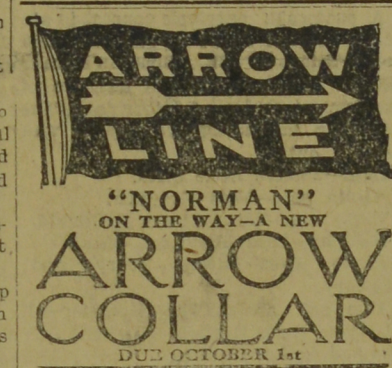
One of the features of the new establishment are the thirteen horse chestnut trees along Fifth avenue. None of these trees was less than 30 years old when they were transplanted a year ago from Germantown, Philadelphia. To give them proper soil it was necessary to blast out solid rock to the depth of six feet, the soil itself being brought from Long Island.

Great difference of opinion exists among architects as to the beauty of the Frick house. It followed out Mr. Frick's own ideas, it is said, which were based upon his purpose of giving the structure upon his death to the city as a museum.

Only three members of the Frick family, Mr. and Mrs. Frick and Miss Helen Clay Frick will occupy the house.

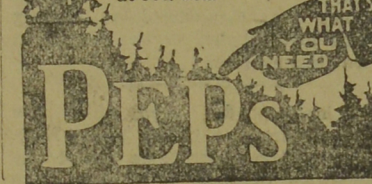

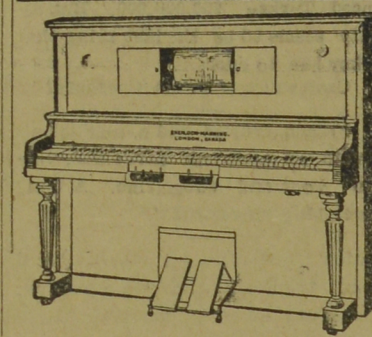


The average annual wage paid female workers in New South Wales factories is \$250.

VILLA MARCHING ON THE MEXICAN CAPITAL

Washington, Nov. 18.—General Villa in command of the troops under the control of the Mexican convention at Aguas Calientes is marching on Mexico City. His army took Leon, the first important railroad centre south of Aguas Calientes without firing a shot.

The forces of General Gonzalez, loyal to Carranza, are gathered at Queretaro, where the first important clash in the hostilities between General Carranza and the convention will probably occur.

These facts were reported in official messages received today from Gen. George C. Carothers, American consular agent accompanying Gen. Villa. Carothers stated that Gen. Villa was well equipped for the march.

From American consul Silliman has come a despatch saying conditions are far more serious in Mexico City than had been since the parleys of peace began. He regards actual hostilities as inevitable, though some of the Generals are still trying to catch up the differences.
