 Fredericton Military Depot for Foreign Service--
 Many War Veterans in the Long List

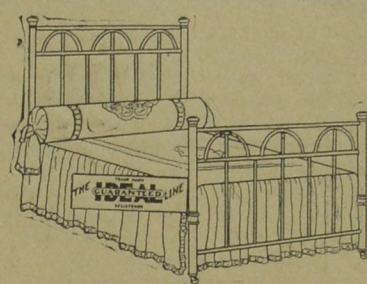
