HONOR A SUBMARINE INVENTER

Paterson, N.J., Aug. 10-The Cham ndorsed a project to raise the first submarine boat from beneath the river bed here, where it has lain for nearly fifteen years and to place it on exhibition as a permanent memodial to the inventor, the late John Holland. While teaching school here in 1897 Holland tested his first submarine boat, sinking it in the Passaic River just above the Passaic Falls. The test was successful, but the original boat was left at the bottom of the river. Holland completed his invention at Elizabethport, N.J. and lived to see it adopted by the United States navy.
