MOCK PARLIAMENT—The students at the U.N.B. had a lively session of their Mock Parliament Saturday evening. The government had a large majority on a vote to amend the address in reply to the Speech from the Throne. F. G. Green, minister of finance, made an able speech when he brought down the budget.

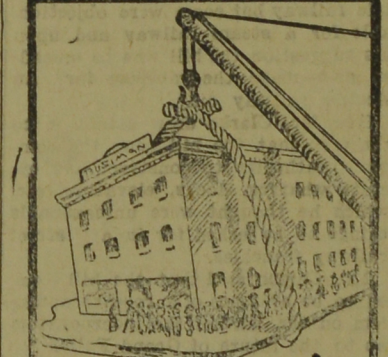
