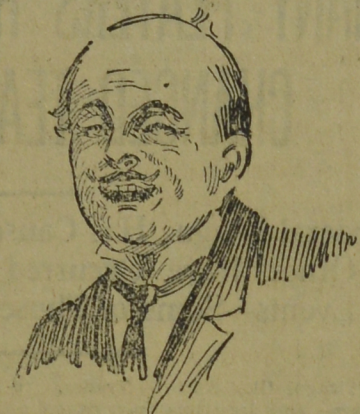

tives, who insisted that a hypothetical compliance with the chairman's ruling was not sufficient. For a time there was a dangerous looking deadlock, as Mr. MacKenzie refused to go any further. Finally, after a lot of cross-firing, the waters were calmed after an appeal by Hon. J. D. Hazen, who was leading the government, for the preservation of parliamentary dignity. Mr. MacKenzie said he withdrew his statement "in the parliamentary sense."

TAXATION OF RAILWAYS

ONE FOR MR. PINDER.

Mr. Carter said that if the member for York, (Pinder) had not completed the building of the Southamptown railway perhaps he would not be so interested in having such safeguards as he suggested made. Some people when they were all fed up and satisfied themselves seemed to forget that there were other people as well.

Mr. White (Victoria) when the section giving the company authority to make connections with other railways operated by electricity, steam or other motive power was under consideration, said he did not think anything should be done to prevent this proposed railway making connections with both steam and electric railways as to make traffic for the new road.

The committee took recess at 6.30 o'clock to sit again at 8 o'clock.

This evening the bill was amended so as to fix three years as the time to commence work, and five years, to complete construction and the title was amended to read "The Grand Falls Electric Company" and with the amendments was agreed to.

Hon. Mr. Flemming (for Hon. Mr. Morrissey) introduced a bill to authorize a loan for certain purposes; also a bill to make further provision for permanent bridges and other works of a permanent character. He explained in regard to the former bill that the construction of the annex to the Normal school had cost considerably more than the estimates, which were made some years ago and a new roof had become necessary for the main building.

The house went into committee with Mr. Pinder in the chair and agreed to the bill to amend the game act.

GAME LAW CHANGED.

Hon. Mr. Flemming said in the act of last year by a typographical error gave permission to hunters to kill three deer, the intention of the act was to increase the cost of license to residents to three dollars instead of two dollars and the word three had been inserted in the wrong place in the act.

The bill under consideration made other slight changes in the law, as it gave a certain amount of protection to foxes, which were becoming scarcer and more valuable, and it also prohibited the use of "silencers" on guns.

Another provision compelled the hunters to take out the carcass of the animal killed and not leave it to rot on the ground.

Mr. Slipp wanted the season for caribou shooting extended for two weeks for the reason that these animals did not come into the south part of the province until late in the fall and while the residents of Northumberland county were able to shoot them fast enough, by the time they reached Sunbury the season had closed.

GAME LAW VIOLATIONS.

Dr. Morehouse wanted some better game protection. Large numbers of game were shot illegally both in season and out and many hunters didn't take out a license. In his own district for the year 1912 fifty-four licenses were taken out by residents; last year there was just as much shooting done, if not more, but only fifteen licenses were sold. It was within his own knowledge that big game was not wanted, only shot and left to rot, he having seen a cow moose and spike horn bull moose shot and simply left where they fell. He knew who had done the shooting and gave all the information to the game warden, together with the proof, but he simply took no action. Wardens of that class were no good.

Hon. Mr. Flemming said that the question of game protection was one in which great difficulties were encountered. Reports were frequently coming to hand of violations, but it was very difficult often to bring the perpetrators to task. With regard to the instance given by the last speaker, a warden who was so careless as he appeared to be should certainly be proceeded against. The department needed the assistance of both its own officials and the members of the house to secure the best men as game wardens. There were signs of improvements in the way the law was being enforced those wardens who were not prepared to properly carry out the duties they undertook should be dispensed with.

The house adjourned at 10.50 p.m. until Monday at 8.30.
