ART DUCHESNIL
WITH BOSTON BRAVES
IN FIRST YEAR

Young French--Canadian Pitcher Has
Made Good in Baseball--With
Pittsfield Last Year

Montreal, April 3--To break into the professional baseball ranks last July and be today a member of the Boston Nationals, is the unique record of Arthur Duchesnil, the Canadian pitcher purchased from the Pittsfield team of the Eastern Association. Duchesnil is a natural ball-player. It was while pitching for a sand-lot team in Montreal that Duchesnil bred the major league germ. He had had phenomenal success with the teams around Montreal and his fame travelled to the States. The Pittsfield team was in a bad way for pitchers when Arthur was recommended to it. He joined the team in July and won the first five games he pitched. He was rated as one of the best pitchers in the association and the Giants and Phillies were keen to grab him. During the short time he was with the Pittsfield team Duchesnil won ten out of sixteen games and ranked second to Hueper of New Haven, for pitching honors of the year. Pittsfield finished sixth in the race, which makes the Canadian's record all the more brilliant.

Art, as he is commonly called by the players, is only twenty-two years old, weighs 177 pounds and is almost six feet in height. He is a handsome man and carries himself with the ease and grace of an athlete. Everybody who has seen the French-Canadian perform here remarks about the strong resemblance between Larry Lajoie and Duchesnil. The latter wears his cap with a slight side tip just as Larry does. In the box he is a twirler of iceberg variety. Nothing fazes him and he shows best with runners on the bases. A ball as fast as that served up by any of the sixteen other pitchers is one of the points in favor of Duchesnil. Then again, no man with the possible exception of Perdue and Rudolph, shows as much control. He bats and also throws right handed.

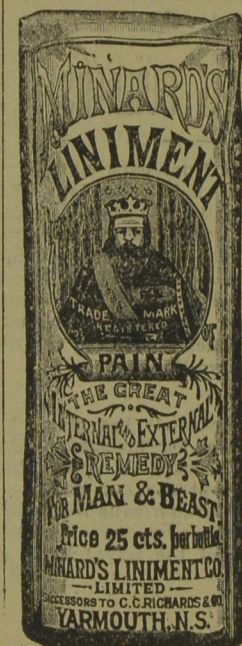

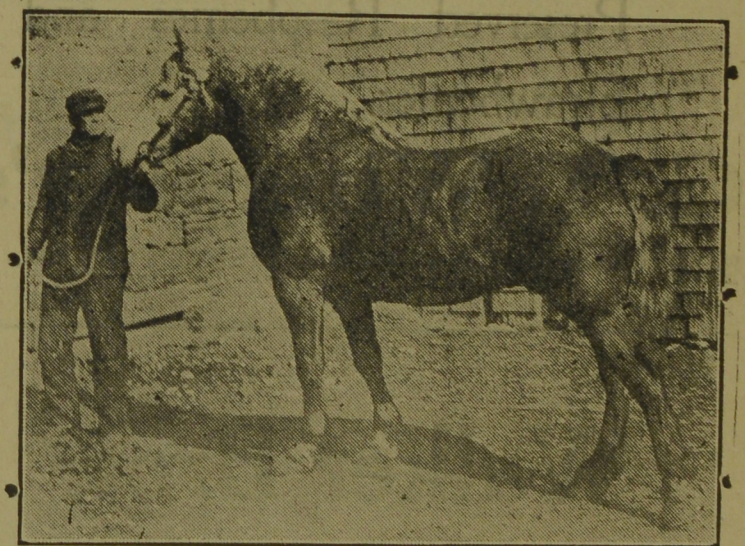
