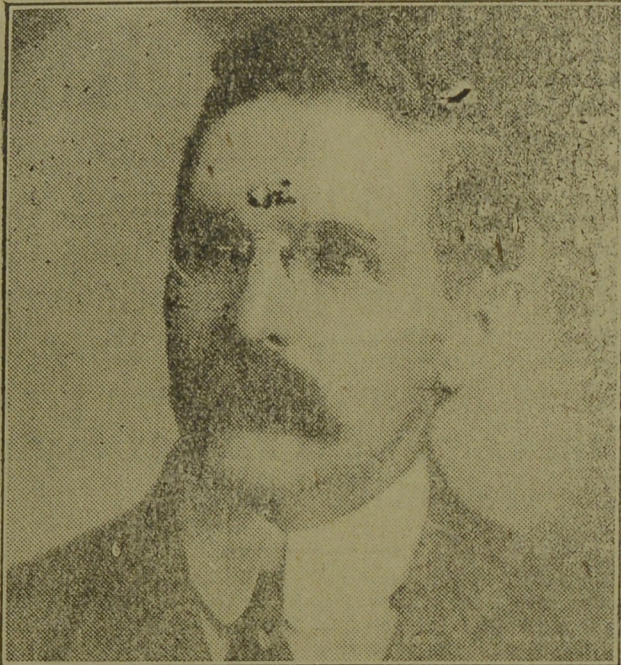

Japanese Thrift
In Japan examples of thriftiness are amazing. On account of the rapidly growing population the people cannot afford to waste the value of a straw. Even the seaweed and octopus serve for food. Hillside that would be given up in Canada as absolutely unfillable have been converted into rice fields in forty irrigated terraces rising above each other on a single slope and made permanent by walls of masonry. JOSEPH FELS DEAD: SINGLE TAX ADVOCATE

Philadelphia, Feb. 22.—Joseph Fels, millionaire soap manufacturer, single tax advocate and philanthropist, died at his home here today from pneumonia, after a brief illness. He was sixty-one years of age.

Mr. Fels spent most of his time advocating the doctrine of single tax in both this country and Great Britain. He recently returned from England, where he had given a large part of his fortune to the creation and maintenance of a single tax cooperative colony near London.

Employees of his firm in this city benefit by a profit-sharing system inaugurated by Mr. Fels.

A GREAT SINGLE TAXER

Although he early became an advocate of Henry George's ideas, it was not until he went to live in England about eight years ago, as the English representative of his firm, that Mr. Fels began to devote almost all of his time, money and energy to the cause of single tax. Not only was he a leader in the cause in this country and England, but he was a large contributor to funds for the single tax campaigns in Canada, New Zealand, Australia, Denmark, Germany, France and Spain, matching dollar for dollar that was spent for the cause.

INTERVIEWED SIR JAMES.

Mr. Fels had visited Canada as a speaker in the tax reform movement. Some time ago during a visit to Toronto he attracted considerable notice by calling on Sir James Whitney, a pronounced opponent of tax reform. He presented the Premier with a copy of Henry George's book, and subsequently gave a character sketch interview describing the conversation.

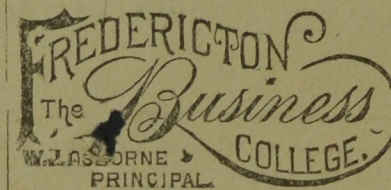
This wonderful Combination Cradle and Crib Bed is one of the latest inventions in the bed line.
