With regard to deposits, it was stated that these have materially increased in recent years. One county estimated a 20 to 39 per cent. increase; another 70 to 90 per cent.; another 75 per cent. No accurate figures could be given of the total amount of farmers' deposits, but from estimates furnished from the different counties, it is assumed that the farmers of Ontario have one hundred million dollars at their credit and that the farm wealth of the Province is valued at \$1,405,950,940.
