CANADA WILL SEND TWO CAVALRY REGIMENTS

Valcartier, Sept. 14-The Canadian government, after communicating with the war office, has decided to increase the first Canadian expeditionary force by adding two com-plete cavalry regiments of five hundred and seventy-five men and thirtyseven officers each.

The regiments to go will be the Strathcoma Horse and the Royal Canadian Dragoons. Both regiments now from part of the Canadian permanent force, but at present they num ber only about three hundred men in each regiment. They will be once recruited up to full war strength

of six hundred and two officers and They will be in addition to the two

cavalry squadrons already assembled at Valcartier.

The Britih war office has intimated that further cavalry troops from Canada will be welcomed and the men of both regiments here are eager to go. The decision of the government to send them means that practically the whole of the permanent force in Canada will go abroad either for service

Elimination of Wood Waste Will Sav Country Many Thousands of Dollars

It has been estimated that in co. verting logs into finished lumber an to over 50 per cent. of the bulk c all trees cut for lumber. This equivalent to an annual loss of fro: \$10 to \$15 for every man, woma and child in the country. At presen it is impracticable from a financ; standpoint to reduce this waste : there is no market for the tree top culls and weed-trees left in lumberin operations, and only a very limite one for the bark, stabs, sawdust, edg ings and trimmings of milling open ations.

The Department of the Interior i recruiting the staff of its Forest Pro ducts Laboratories, recently establish ed in connection with the Forestr Branch, with skilled mechanical an chemical engineers and by constant experimentation it is hoped to find commercial use for these products. Timber has often been shunned a a structural material because no re liable figures regarding its strengtl were available, and when complete tests have been made it is, regarded as certain that a demand will b created for some of Canada's tree species which are now left in th.



The Forestry Branch of the Depart ment of the Interior, Ottawa, of which these laboratories are one develop ment, has recently issued a circular describing the various lines of investigation to be followed at these laboratories. Not the least important will be to develop chemical methods for utilizing minor wood wastes and another circular written by the engineer in charge of this work deals with the general aspects of the subject. \A large percentag of the small-sized waste wood can be utilized by the process known as "destructive distillation," but the machinery employed in this process is not very efficient. The manufacture of ethyl alcohol and producer gas from sawdust has already been proved

feasible, and the securing as Super intendent of the Laboratories of John S. Bates, B.A., B.Sc., one of the fore most authorities on wood-pulp manu facture in America, ensures the development of this Branch of Wood Utilization.
