Jane Warton



Corporal-Major Grainger Chowd King  
A Few Tricks

Among those who displayed their prowess before the King at a Life Guards' assault-at-arms was Corporal-Major Grainger, who has won the title of the best man of arms (dismounted) in the British army. ### B. C. Water Power Survey

A party of engineers of the Conservation Commission examined the water power situation in the district tributary to the watersheds of the following rivers in interior British Columbia: Skeena, Kispic, Bulkley, Morice, Telkwa, Yemoetz and Klusquam rivers. The season was an unusually wet one, and the country traversed very rough with consequent poor trails, that in many instances required clearing, so that progress was necessarily slow. In spite of this, twenty-six streams in all were examined and twenty-eight power sites reported upon.
