Whifst the home will be directly under the joint auspices of the Methodist and Presbyterian churches, it will be a Protestant home on broad non-sectarian lines. Baptists will deal officially with the matter at their forthcoming conventions but their executive committee warmly endorses the project and commends it to their people for moral and financial support. The bishops of Nova Scotia and Fredericton will submit the matter to their synods and personally favor the movement and urge their people to support the


