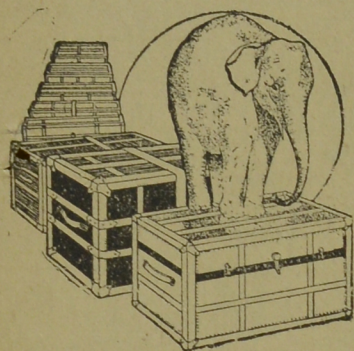

Montreal, June 5.—The grand jury  
today found a true bill against Ed-
