ed to the front. An official statement today declares that His Majesty has been completely restored to health and has left Berlin to join his army in the field. The Kaiser was accompanied to the front by the ministers of war, marine and foreign affairs.

## THREW BOMBS INTO WARSAW

Rome, Dec. 21--The "Kurier" Warsawki reports that a Zeppelin on December 9th threw eighteen bombs into Warsaw. Two houses were demolished, ninety citizens killed and fifty wounded.

## TURKS WERE REPULSED

Petrograde, Dec. 21--The army messenger says an engagement with considerable Turkish forces is taking a course favorable to our troops. A night attack by Turks near the village of Allageuse was repulsed with great loss.

THE TRITONIA DISASTER.

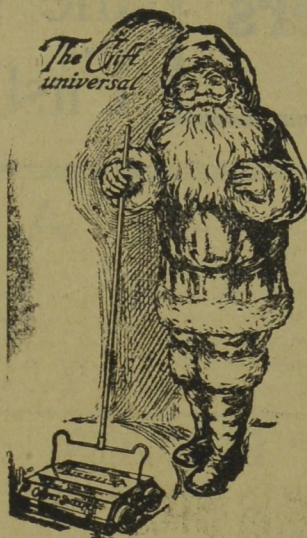
