GERMANS DEFEATED

port issued here tonight.

London, Sept. 11.—The times says editorially: "If we are to observe due proportion in examining the various phases of this spacious war, there can be no doubt that pride of place must be assigned today to the astonishing achievements of Russia."

"While the allies in the West have been steadily battling against mighty and highly efficient armies, she has been shattering an ancient empire. No smaller result can follow the brilliant operations of the Russians in Galicia and southern Poland."

The morning Post says: "It seems hardly possible for Austria to recover her military strength, and if the Russian armies in Galicia can continue their rapid advance, Austria must in a short time be considered off the board."

INDIAN TROOPS CROSS CANADA

Toronto, Sept. 10.—(via Buffalo, the Canadian censorship having prohibited transmission of this information by telegraph)—The reason why Canada's Militia have been delayed in going to the front is not the reported presence of German cruisers on the Atlantic, but the fact that at least 30,000 East Indian veterans have been rushed across Canada and have been pushed ahead of the Dominion's Militia on the transports.

This accounts for the disembarkation of the Princess Patricia Light Infantry from the White Star Liner Megantic a week ago last Saturday at Point Levis, opposite Quebec, after going aboard for Liverpool. The Minister of Militia and Defence, the Hon. Samuel Hughes, offered an explanation for this change of plans, but let the public infer that German cruisers had been reported in the Gulf of St. Lawrence.

The Indian troops were rushed aboard the Megantic and the Princess Patricia Light Infantry is still in camp at Point Levis.

The 30,000 soldiers that have been rushed across Canada in ninety special trains comprise Sikhs and Ghorchhas, the veteran troops of Britain's East Indian Army.

Other contingents will follow them. Their number has not been officially given but is placed at possibly 100,000. The Megantic carried the vanguard, and others as they arrived were dispatched on special transport. The Megantic should reach Liverpool next Sunday or earlier.

IN HOSPITAL AT QUEBEC.

Word has been received here stating that Mr. Earle Leaman, of Moncton who has been at Val Cartier with the first contingent from the 71st Regiment is now confined in one of the Quebec hospitals suffering from appendicitis.

Following the service at the church, the party had tea at the bride's residence.

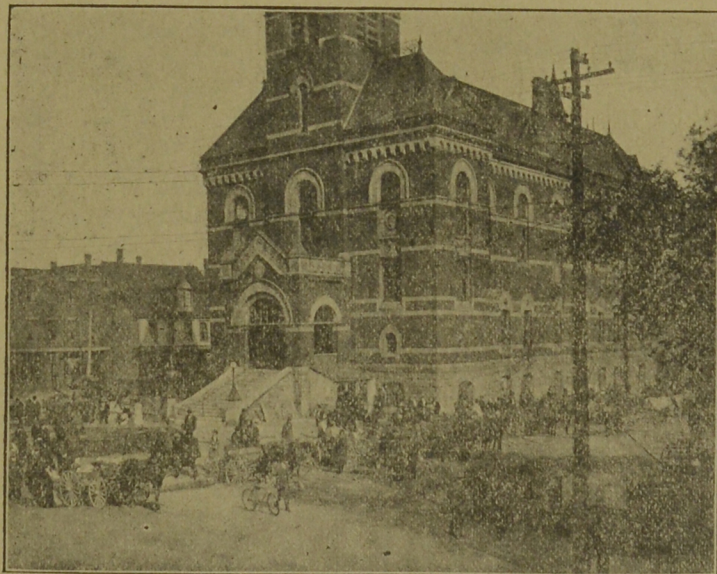

The country market this morning was one of the largest seen in this city for some time there being over one hundred and forty teams lined up along the three sides of Phoenix Square and for some distance down Queen Street. Eggs were in abundance and sold at from 27 to 30 cents per dozen, while butter was selling
