HON. J. K. FLEMMING ARRIVES TO TAKE HAND IN MUSS

No Saw-off between Thomas and Guthrie
Factions Likely---J. K. Pinder in City Today---Interviews Ex-Mayor Thomas

Premier Flemming arrived here today in response to the agonized call that went out for him to come and prevent an open rupture in convention tomorrow when the Conservatives will meet to nominate a candidate for the vacancy in York county's representation in the provincial house. Meetings of both the supporters of ex-Ald. P. A. Guthrie and ex-Mayor C. H. Thomas are being held today. Every effort is being made to have the anti-Guthrie section withdraw its support from Mr. Thomas, but it is expected to prove futile. Mr. Thomas' backers are out to prevent the graft element from continuing to control the party and a stiff fight is expected Thursday afternoon, when the convention will meet at the County Court House.

James K. Pinder, M.P.P., is in the city today and conferred this morning with ex-Mayor Thomas. Mr. Pinder's sympathies are strongly with Mr. Thomas and his influence will be with him tomorrow afternoon. Mr. Pinder, according to present expectation, will either move of second Mr. Thomas' nomination.

Reports from the parishes now indicate that the overwhelming majority of Guthrie delegates, which was expected, will not materialize. Mr. Thomas will have many supporters from the rural districts.

SCOTT ACT RAID ON LONG'S HOTEL UNSUCCESSFUL

Search by Police This Afternoon Revealed no Liquor on the Premises
---Further Developments Are Expected

Long's Hotel was the scene of another Scott Act raid by the police at about two o'clock this afternoon. Policeman Marshall read the warrant. He was accompanied by Policeman Hughes. Chief McCollom was also present. The search was not as successful as two others made last autumn. It is understood that no liquor was found about the hotel premises, although careful search was made.

This is the third raid made upon this hotel under the present management. About the time of the exhibition a large quantity of liquor, etc., was seized.

It is reported that the proprietor of the hotel has taken objection to methods pursued in making the search today and that more will be heard of the matter.

TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE.






