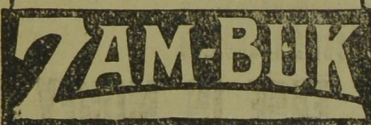

BONFIRE OF STEEL

Heat From a Rubbish Blaze Ignited Steel Chips

A bonfire of steel chips, set afire from the heat of a rubbish fire near by, gave an odd trouble to a manufacturer. Three times the fire was subdued with water, but was finally put out only by raking it apart, and then it was found that a considerable proportion of the chips had burned up, so that the pile was a third less high than before the blaze. Several carloads of chips were piled up in the factory yard and all were free from oil, as they had been run through a machine that removed it. Soon after the rubbish fire had been started smoke was seen coming from the steel pile, and it was discovered that some of the steel was white hot. Water seemed to put out the blaze, but after a drenching the steel began burning again and it was two days before the fire was all out. The manufacturer's theory was that, after the steel had been started by heat from the neighboring fire, the fine chips presented so much surface to oxygen and the surface of the pile gave comparatively so little area for radiation that the steel just had to burn.

EXPENSIVE HANDKERCHIEFS

One That is Valued at \$30,000—Costly Wearing Apparel

Some time before his death the Marquess of Anglesey purchased three dozen handkerchiefs for evening dress wear. They were of pure white linen, with his crest worked in human hair in the corners. These handkerchiefs came from Switzerland, and cost \$63.00 a dozen.

It is interesting to know that the late Duc d'Albe, uncle of the Empress Eugenie, was in the habit of ordering twelve dozen handkerchiefs at a time, for which he paid \$105.00 a dozen.

Perhaps the most expensive handkerchief in existence is in the possession of the Italian royal family. It took three women more than five years to make, and is valued at \$30,000.

One of the Bulgarian princes has the peculiar hobby of collecting dressing gowns. His wardrobe contains an enormous number of these articles of apparel, many of which are worth \$500 each. Some time ago he had a dressing-gown specially made for him in Paris, for which he paid \$600.

The Gaekwar of Baroda has a coat woven of gold and embroidered with diamonds and rubies, which cost \$125,000; the Emir of Scindia possesses a coat of brilliant scarlet and a cap of black and gold studded with gems which are worth over \$150,000; while the Maharajah of Patiala spent nearly \$200,000 on a garb of purple satin and a turban, thick with pearls, diamonds and emeralds.

The province of New Brunswick has this distinction: it possesses the only sardine fishery in Canada. The fishing is carried on in the waters of Passamaquoddy Bay and the waters around the Islands of Grand Manan and Campobello, and the West Isles. In the Bay of Fundy. Of such importance is this fishery, and in such masses do the fish appear that the fishermen who prosecute their calling amongst those islands depend largely upon it for their livelihood.

MICROBE EATS METAL

This Bacillus Has an Action Upon Iron and Steel

Although science knew a hundred micro-organisms that devour the human tissues and cause all sorts of maladies, and also many that eat plants, roots, dirt, wood, and clothing, it had never been imagined that there was one capable of eating up bits of steel and iron. Yet a discovery made by E. M. Mumford, an English student, showed that this is the case.

This species of bacillus varies in its digestive action upon iron and steel compounds according to whether it acts in the presence or absence of air. When oxygen is present the iron is precipitated by the germs as iron bog-ore, while in the absence of oxygen no iron salts are formed. This iron-eating germ is a short microbe about one-thousandth of an inch long. It grows readily on potatoes and then looks greenish-brown in color. It also colonizes in milk, gelatine, and agar

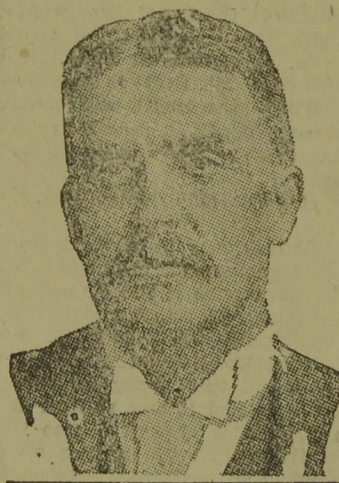

SEAWEED UTILIZED

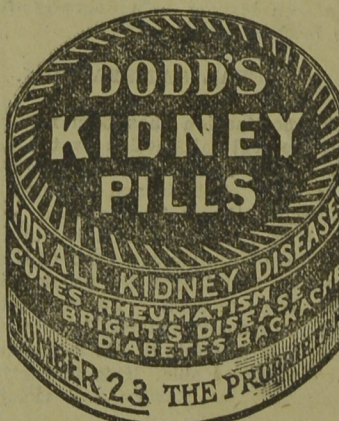
A Valuable Commodity Created From a Nuisance

Prince Edward Island, which became famous as a fox farming country, has extended its activities into another field. Business men of the Island were carried away with the phenomenal success of fox farming, which in some cases returned them 35%, while the average dividend reported by thirteen companies was 20%. These large returns from what is a unique and unusual enterprise led some of the more ambitious Islanders to go into another untrodden field—the using of seaweed for commercial purposes. It is well known that seaweed is very largely used in furniture making, the dried product selling around \$46 per ton. Companies were formed to put the business on a commercial basis. A gasoline-driven motor mower controlled from a motor boat cuts the seaweed which is then loaded into a scow, brought to the shore and dried in the sun. According to the optimistic promoters, the industry has an almost unlimited future and will be very profitable as they create a valuable commodity out of something which has heretofore been regarded as of no value and rather as a nuisance. It will be somewhat unique if Prince Edward Island makes as great a success out of seaweed as it has out of fox farming.

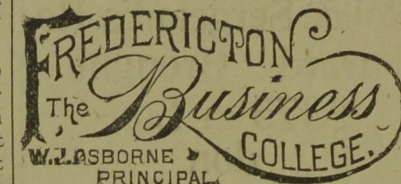

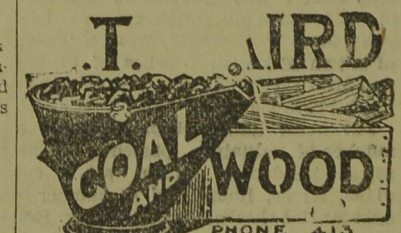
